The Autopsy of a Deceased Church

by Thom S. Rainer

In the past few months every Bible Study of mine as well as Church Council and Staff have been studying a book entitled: *The Autopsy of a Deceased Church* by Thom S. Rainer. The book is about God's church. God cares about His church. God loves his church.

What we know today is that many churches are dying. Dr. Thom Rainer has helped churches reverse this trend and has "autopsied" those that have died. From his experience he discovered consistent themes among those churches that have died. It is not all doom and gloom because from those themes, lessons on how to keep our church alive and vibrant have emerged.

Each month we will be reviewing some of his findings so that we can <u>keep Grace Lutheran Church alive to the</u> <u>glory of God and continue to advance Christ's Kingdom!</u> The following are excerpts from his book.

Chapter 3-The Past is the Hero

Thom tells us in chapter 3 "that there were several points where these churches could have reversed the decline they were experiencing. But the remaining members refused to see reality. If they had faced reality and, in God's power, reversed course there would not have been a need for an autopsy! But they didn't.

The most common thread of his autopsies was that the deceased churches lived for a long time with the past as the hero. They held onto the past more tightly with each year. They just couldn't change.

Now they were not holding onto biblical truths...nor clear Christian morality. They were not fighting for doctrine. They were fighting for the past. The good old days. The way it used to be.

Thom shared that he received an e-mail from someone who was really mad. He was mad about music styles, about church architecture, about audio speakers and big screens and even appropriate church attire. For him the past was the hero. Now don't get me wrong. There is much to revere and remember about the past, but we are to respect the past. At times we might revere the past. But we cannot live in the past."

So here is the list of items that churches clung to:

- 1. Worship styles. Fixed orders of worship services. And times of worship services.
- 2. Some stubbornly held onto buildings and rooms
- 3. Some would not accept a new pastor except that one pastor who served 30 years ago.
- 4. But more than any one item, these dying churches focused on their own needs instead of others. They looked inwardly instead of outwardly.

They were warned. They were facing certain death. They saw every sign. But they preferred death to change!"

Chapter 4-The Church Refused to Look Like the Community

Thom suggested that "we look at the faces of the members before the church 'officially' died. Now look at the faces of the people who live in the community where the church is located. Are they significantly different? Thom shared that when a church ceases to have a heart and ministry for its community, it is on the path toward death. Whenever local churches are mentioned in the New Testament, they are always exhorted to be othercentered.

Paul told the church at Philippi to look after the interests of others even as it considered its own interests: "If then there is any encouragement in Christ, if any consolation of love, if an fellowship with the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, fulfill my joy by thinking the same way, having the same love, sharing the same feelings, focusing on one goal. Do nothing out of rivalry, or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves. Everyone should look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others" (Phil. 2:1-4).

Did you get that? Vibrant and living churches look after the interests of others. They are concerned for their communities. They open the door for others. But unfortunately dying churches are concerned with self-preservation. They are concerned with a certain way of doing church. They are all about self. Their doors are closed to the community.

Thom's autopsy revealed that at some point in the history of the church they just stopped reaching and caring for the community. How could we tell? The church did not look like ore reflect the community in which it was located."

Prayerful Commitment: God, give my church and me a heart for our community. Let me see the people through Your eyes. And give me the courage and the wisdom to let go of this church, so that others who best reflect this community can lead us and teach us. Amen
