Holy Communion or the Lord's Supper is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ. The elements (bread & wine) are consecrated on an altar or communion table. We believe that the true body and blood of Christ are present "in, with, and under" the bread and wine.

The manner of receiving the Eucharist differs in the world. Throughout the history of Grace Lutheran Church, we have practiced a variety of distribution methods: at the altar, from the sanctuary floor, intinction, private communion at homes and hospitals, and even at outdoor worship.

God is with us through the word and elements of bread and wine. Whether we offer Holy Communion in church, in fox holes, or at a traffic accident, God comes to us.

Starting on Sunday, October 2, we will be having Holy Communion on the floor like we do at the Saturday evening service and 10:00 Sunday service. We are doing this for several reasons:

- 1. God is with us no matter where we take Holy Communion.
- 2. For the safety of our members, we will no longer require them to climb the stairs.

Please be patient with us as we begin to try this new method of distribution. May we celebrate the gifts given to us by a loving God.

All the quilts made this year will be displayed on the back of each of the pews. A blessing will be said at each service for the quilts and kits before we pack them for shipping. We invite everyone in the congregation to help us pack the quilts and kits on Monday, September 19 beginning at 9 a.m.


We are especially grateful to the congregation for donating their Noisy Offerings for the months of July, August and September to Project Comfort. Project Comfort helps to cover the cost of shipping the quilts and kits to where they are so desperately needed. Thank you for all your generous donations to the Noisy Offering.

This year we are giving the congregation an opportunity to take part in this ministry. There are several items that are needed to complete our kits for Lutheran World Relief. The items are listed below. We ask you to bring them with you to the service of your choice on Thankoffering weekend. During the service we will ask you to come forward and place the items in a wooden box located on the steps to the altar.

We are in need of the following items: #2 pencils (unsharpened), 2 1/2" eraser, ball point pens, blunt scissors, pencil sharpener, 70 sheet notebooks, ruler with centimeters, bath-sized bars of soap, bath-size towel (light weight, dark color), hand towel (dark color), large-tooth comb, metal nail clipper, adult-size toothbrush.

WHY DO THE WOMEN CELEBRATE THANKOFFERING?

This tradition dates back to the early 1900's when small Thankoffering boxes were given to Lutheran women to place in a special location in their homes. The women would add coins to the boxes as particular blessings were noted. These Thankofferings show our gratitude for God's blessings. From the use of these boxes came the idea of an annual church service to celebrate the collecting of these boxes. These Thankofferings are sent to the churchwide women's organization. Each year, in thousands of Lutheran congregations, Thankofferings are collected and sent to support the life-changing ministries of the ELCA. Together, we do more than we could ever do apart. In gratitude for all God has given to us, and with hope for all that is to come, we collect our Thankofferings. Here at Grace, while the women still bring in their Thankofferings, we have included the blessing of the quilts and kits in our Thankoffering service as a part of our offerings. These quilts and kits are given to Lutheran World Relief (LWR) to be distributed to families all over the world as a helping hand, a sign of comfort and hope for the future.



News & Updates: August 2016

LIFT has been an organization for several years. LIFT is a parish ministry that allows our congregations to do projects together that a single congregation could not or at the very least would be very difficult to do by themselves. It also allows smaller congregations to continue to worship with a shared ministry.

Earlier this year LIFT become a formal organization by registering as a LLC (limited liability corporation). This formal organization was voted on and approved overwhelmingly by Grace, St. John's, St. Mark, and Trinity. What has really changed? Well nothing really as far as our ministry goes. We are still doing many of the same activities together as we did before. The formal organization does open up many possibilities that can be very beneficial to all the member congregations. Some of them are:

- LIFT events can be covered under the LIFT insurance liability coverage thereby protecting individual congregations.
- Copyright and licenses can be purchased through LIFT instead of each congregation such as music copyrights, Shepherds Staff (accounting program), etc.
- LIFT could be used as an insurance purchasing agent for the member congregations if all property and liability insurance for all congregations were purchased under a single policy the cost would be cheaper for everyone.
- more able to receive grants as a single source for LIFT projects

These are just some possibilities that can be explored for the future.

Our shared ministry is very exciting in the respect that you get to see firsthand the impact it has. The many activities Love Your Neighbor Day, LOMO Summer Camp, Vacation Bible School, Iglesia Camino de Vida, Puente De Esperanza, Back to School Give Away, and Outdoor Worship are some of the many activities that we do together. These ministries are important for reaching out to the community to share the love of Christ.

Earlier this month we had a LIFT meeting at St. John's. There were about 70 people there to share thoughts and ideas for future activities. Aside from member and associate member congregations also in attendance were representatives from St. Paul's Episcopal and Emmanuel in Hessville. Both of these congregations have expressed interest in learning more about LIFT and possibly joining LIFT.

It was at this meeting that we announced that the LIFT name change. LIFT may include more denominations than Lutherans in the future. I think this a very appropriate change since we are all Christian and on the same team. The new name is "Living In Faith Together." It is exciting to see that the ministry we share has great growth possibilities with more members in the future. Faith is planning to vote on joining LIFT as a member this fall. Please keep them in your prayers as they prepare to make this decision.

Some upcoming events are the tent at the Sandusky County Fair and the outdoor worship. The theme at the fair tent will be "Let Your Light Shine." We will be giving glow sticks out to children and handing out pamphlets to the adults that give a brief overview of LIFT and all the member congregations and activities. The booth will be staffed by members from each of our congregations. We thank St. Paul's Episcopal for allowing us to share their tent. The outdoor worship is September 25 at the fairgrounds at 10:00 a.m. Each year the event gets better. This is a great opportunity for fellowship and worshipping together as one body in Christ - Living In Faith Together.

On August 30 we will have a LIFT Board meeting at St. Johns. I would encourage you to contact any of the board members if you have an activity or event you would like to be considered. LIFT is an extension of your congregation. would also encourage you to join any one of the seven small groups of LIFT that you have an interest in. These groups play a critical role in planning and carrying out the activities we do together. I have included the names of the LIFT Board members for your convenience.

The last topic is a vision of sorts. I look at our congregations and we all look the same i.e. we are getting old. Who is there to take our place? I hear from many myself included the younger folks just don't go to church. They have too many other things going on. I say to you we need to look no farther than Grace Community, Victory Christian, Sacred Heart, Trinity Evangelical (Upper Sandusky) to see that young people do go to church and are active in their faith and therefore our premise is wrong. We need to pray and ask for God's guidance to adjust our ministry to be more attractive to youth and young families. I believe we must also do the same for our minority community. We have plenty of worship space and could have a variety of worship services from the traditional to contemporary and

everything in between. The church must go to the people as opposed to the people going to the church. This will take us out of our comfort zone - but we must become a little uncomfortable to fulfill our mission.
