The Pastor's Corner



Matthew 5:16 "¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

This verse from Matthew is another of my favorites. It is all about our journey here on earth and our call to shine for others. Light functions in order to allow us to see. It is difficult for us in the Western world to imagine a world without light. When it was nightfall, in the ancient world, it was dark: in darkness, "we grope like the blind along a wall, groping like those who have no eyes" (Isaiah 59:10).

Jesus uses this image of light not simply to allow others to see whatever they wish, but it is for others to witness the acts of justice that Jesus' followers perform. Beyond that, it allows the others to recognize the cause of these actions, the God of heaven.

"Author Robert Fulghum tells this story of one of his professors, a wise man whose name was Alexander Papaderos:

At the last session on the last morning of a two week seminar on Greek culture, Dr. Papaderos turned and made the ritual gesture: "Are there any questions?"

Quiet quilted the room. These two weeks had generated enough questions for a lifetime, but for now, there was only silence.

"No questions?" Papaderos swept the room with his eyes. So, I asked, "Dr. Papaderos, what is the meaning of life?"

The usual laughter followed, and people stirred to go. Papaderos held up his hand and stilled the room and looked at me for a long time, asking with his eyes if I was serious and seeing from my eyes that I was.

"I will answer your question."

Taking his wallet out of his hip pocket, he fished into a leather billfold and brought out a very small round mirror, about the size of a quarter. And what he said went something like this:

"When I was a small child, during the war, we were very poor and we lived in a remote village. One day, on the road, I found the broken pieces of a mirror. A German motorcycle had been wrecked in that place.

"I tried to find all the pieces and put them together, but it was not possible, so I kept

only the largest piece. This one. And by scratching it on a stone, I made it round. I began to play with it as a toy and became fascinated by the fact that I could reflect light into dark places where the sun would never shine in deep holes and crevices and dark closets. It became a game for me to get light into the most inaccessible places I could find.

"I kept the little mirror, and as I went about my growing up, I would take it out in idle moments and continue the challenge of the game. As I became a man, I grew to understand that this was not just a child's game but a metaphor for what I might do with my life. I came to understand that I am not the light or the source of light. But light, truth, understanding, knowledge is there, and it will only shine in many dark places if I reflect it.

"I am a fragment of a mirror whose whole design and shape I do not know. Nevertheless, with what I have I can reflect light into the dark places of this world into the black places in the hearts of men and change some things in some people. Perhaps others may see and do likewise. This is what I am about. This is the meaning of life."

And then he took his small mirror and, holding it carefully, caught the bright rays of daylight streaming through the window and reflected them onto my face and onto my hands folded on the desk.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world" (John 9:5), and as his followers, we are to be like that little mirror, reflecting the light of Christ into the dark corners of the world. That is the meaning of the Christian life. "Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

The time has come for us to be the light of the world. To shine with the glory of God his character. When people see in us the character of God then the message will spread like wild fire.



A NOTE FROM THE ENDOWMENT BOARD OF GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH:

Question: I would like to give money to Grace Lutheran Church, but how can I make sure that the gift will be lasting?

Answer: Endow for the future. The Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is designed to preserve the principal and a portion of the earnings, and use the remainder of the earnings to fulfill our mission. Because only a portion of the annual earnings on our Fund are used each year, the Fund continues to grow, buffering the Fund against inflation and providing a permanent source of support to our mission.

Question: What is an endowment fund?

Answer: The Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is a repository for unexpected gifts or unusual gifts or special-purpose gifts. An endowment fund is also a repository for plans and projects that are unexpected or unusual or have a special purpose. However, primarily, an endowment fund is focused on the long-term financial future of the congregation. An endowment fund receives gifts and funds of various types, invests those gifts and funds for long-term growth and distributes income from those investments to current projects in support of the congregation's mission.

A congregation needs an endowment fund in several circumstances: When they have property or money which should not be spent currently but should be held for future needs; when they have a special project that needs long-term planning and long-term fund raising; when they develop a vision of a future need that will require significant financial support, beyond what the annual budget can provide.





Since 2005, **Soles4Souls** has delivered over 19 million



pairs of new and gently worn shoes. The shoes have been distributed to people in over 125 countries, including Kenya, Thailand, Nepal, and the United States.

YOU CAN HELP by donating some of the 700 MILLION pairs of shoes thrown away by Americans each year. We will be accepting your "extra" pairs of shoes. There are collection boxes at each entrance to the Sanctuary. Please rubber band your extra pair (s) of shoes and drop them in the collection box.

Soles4Souls accepts all types of shoes: athletic, running, dress, sandals, pumps, heels, work boots, cleats, dance, flip flops... just as long as they are gently worn.

Once collected, all shoes are processed and graded either by **Sole4Souls** staff in Wadley, Alabama or by Village Northwest Unlimited, a nonprofit training facility for people with disabilities located in Sheldon, Iowa. New and high grade shoes are earmarked for crisis relief distribution in the United States or abroad. Lower grade used shoes and shoes inappropriate for crisis relief (e.g. high heeled shoes) are provided to microenterprise programs in developing countries such as Haiti, Tanzania, and Honduras. Shoes that cannot be used, are recycled into clean energy at an energy-from-waste facility in Huntsville, Alabama.

By recycling your gently worn shoes with the **Sole4Souls**, your discarded footwear will be given a second chance at life. By being redistributed through **Soles4Souls** international and domestic partners, millions of children and adults could receive their first pair of shoes.


