It is always easy to spot a dead tree. It is the one where the dead leaves hold on! Living trees shed their leaves as a part of life. It's to



protect the tree. It also makes the tree less heavy when coated with ice because of less surface area. It makes the tree more wind resistant during winter storms. If they did not lose their leaves every fall, the winter could damage the tree badly or kill it.

Even though I have been in my walk of faith for many years, there are still many things which I need to shed as well. Just because many of my habits have existed for years, it doesn't mean that they are good habits. But oh, how hard it is to give them up!

I am reminded every time I see a dead tree with leaves still clinging... that I need to cast aside my "old leaves." Thank God that even though I hold onto old "leaves," I am not dead, but have been reborn again through Jesus Christ.

And so as I walk each morning, I am reminded about how much I need God in my life... especially when the leaves begin to fall all around me.

May all the dead "leaves" of your life fall away on your journey of faith... May you feel the presence of God all around you... May you always know to whom you belong...


