

Dear Friends in Christ,

This is my annual report for Lift, but since not everyone sees that report I thought it would be a good thing to include this in the newsletter as well. I often get asked this question by colleagues, church members, family, friends, and others; "Since you are not a

church Pastor what do you do?" The question is never asked with a mean heart or with evil intent. It is merely asked out of genuine curiosity as to what the Lift Parish Pastor actually does for all of the member churches. So with that in mind I came up with this chart based on what my calendar for 2017 reflected.

## Some insights into these numbers

- This year I have led worship services at Bethany/Trinity, St. Mark, Grace, St. John's, Emmanuel, Hayes UMC, St. John's in Bellevue, and Faith.
- I call Memorial Hospital every day from Monday-Thursday. Pastor Jody, Pastor Matt, and Maureen Pump call on other days so that someone calls the hospital to check on Lutherans every day of the year. Our arrangement with Memorial is unique and it does not include any of the other hospitals in the area. If you would like for a pastor to visit please contact one of the pastors in the parish. Especially if you are going to Toledo or Cleveland as we need to reserve a half day in our schedules to meet that need. This is a primary concern of the Lift Parish and we need cooperation from all of you to improve this ministry.
- As the Lift Pastor I attend these meetings monthly; Church Council x3, Worship Team x3, Lift Evangelism Team, Lift Stewardship Team, Lift pastors, Lift Executive, and Lift Board. I also organize and attend the Fremont Ministerial Association meetings.
- These numbers do not include time for sermon prep, study, reading, praying, reflecting, visioning, or dreaming.

This is a reflection on the year past as we continue to work together to create a unified and effective Parish ministry with all of our Lift partner churches. I look forward to 2018 and the next steps in this vital ministry in the ELCA and NWOS. Please stay connected through the Lift Facebook page or the Lift website. There will be many new opportunities to plug yourself into the ministry going forward as the Lift Parish seeks to create an atmosphere of Prayer, Discipleship, Servanthood, and Holy living.

The following is from the list of expectations that came with the Lift Parish pastor's position to which I was called. The LIFT Churches seek to jointly call a new ordained pastor to serve the smaller congregations as their primary pastor, and all the congregations in an associate role in pastoral care and evangelical outreach.

### **Expectations**

- A. Be able to use technology and media-This new call to the LIFT churches will require one to be skilled in webpage development and social media. Since this position will be the coordination of several churches, communication will be a key strength needed. As we continue to move forward communicating information between and among the churches will be paramount.
- B. Be able to share leadership and work in a team-The pastors of these congregations are already working together closely. We work as a team utilizing each person's gifts. If one is gifted in a specific area, then they are responsible for their areas of expertise. The mission of God is the most important focus for our team. It will need to be yours as well!
- C. Provide care and nurture-This position will be responsible for the pastoral care of all locations. As such the Associate Pastor will be visiting all hospitals, including those in Toledo and Cleveland as needed. This new position will be responsible for visiting nursing homes and conducting services as prearranged on a monthly calendar. And finally, this role will be responsible for leading the Eucharist Ministers who visit those who are home bound and unable to attend worship.
- D. Build a sense of community among the people with whom he/she works-Since this is a coalition of the willing that are participating in LIFT, it is very important that the sense of community between all the people continue to be built. We are seeking to teach our congregations that we are all part of the same body...the body of Christ. We no longer want to be silos each doing our "own thing." So for us community is everything!
- E. Be an effective communicator-This also ties into the media expectation. This person will be the link between all the congregations and the pastors. This person will be the communicator of everything about LIFT.

As you can see there are some things I still need to grow into as the Parish Pastor. I am a work in progress. However, there are also some things that each of you need to grow into to make this parish a success and a model for the ELCA. Let us do this holy work together. I would love to hear your thoughts. I would really like people's honest opinion on how you see the Parish and what we can do to improve it or if you feel that we need it at all. Everything that is said will be held in the strictest confidence, but I want to write a reflection of what I learned in next month's Newsletter to keep everyone informed as to the direction we will walk together.
