The Autopsy of a Deceased Church

by Thom S. Rainer

In the past few months every Bible Study of mine as well as Church Council and Staff have been studying a book entitled: *The Autopsy of a Deceased Church* by Thom S. Rainer. The book is about God's church. God cares about His church. God loves his church.

What we know today is that many churches are dying. Dr. Thom Rainer has helped churches reverse this trend and has "autopsied" those that have died. From his experience he discovered consistent themes among those churches that have died. It is not all doom and gloom because from those themes, lessons on how to keep our church alive and vibrant have emerged.

Each month we will be reviewing some of his findings so that we can **keep Grace Lutheran Church alive to the glory of God and continue to advance Christ's Kingdom!** *The following are excerpts from his book.*

Chapter 5-The Budget Moved Inwardly

When we autopsy a church one must always follow the money. Often for deceased churches there are many predictable patterns. One such pattern is that the money over time becomes focused inwardly. Often times the personnel portion of the budget steadily increases over the years. It is not that they are paying them more; rather the personnel portion of the budget increased proportionally to the declining total each year. These churches had less to spend, but personnel costs were often the last to be cut.

Why? Because these churches saw the staff as a whole as their personal caretakers. Staff was to spend most of their time visiting, counseling, attending functions with members, etc.

Don't get me wrong, in vibrant churches the staff often meets the needs of the members. This is part of their calling. But in the dying churches, the staff is expected to almost exclusively be on call for church members. That means that staff members are not reaching out to others beyond the church. That means that they are not involved in the community.

Likewise, building and facility costs are reduced only as a last resort.

What costs are made? Just follow the money. In most cases cuts were made to ministries and programs with outward foci. So funds to reach beyond the church are no longer available. The decision is justified by declining receipts. Fair enough. But notice that the outreach and community ministries are the first to go.

Follow the money. You will learn much about a church. By the way not all the churches died broke. Many had a treasure chest when they died. Some had inherited funds. Others had accumulated funds.

You don't have to be broke to be dying. It is not a matter of how much you have. It is what you do with your money, or what your attitude is about the money. They no longer ask how the church can make a difference for the Kingdom with the money. They accumulate because they fear not having enough money.

The money was symptomatic of a heart problem. The church cared more for its own needs than the community and the world. And no church can sustain such an inward focus indefinitely. It will eventually die of heart failure.

Chapter 6-The Great Commission Becomes the Great Omission

When the past is the hero certain symptoms appear. These symptoms can become sicknesses themselves, sicknesses that lead to death. Some churches begin with a great heart and a great effort toward the Great Commission. But the methods used become the focus rather than the Great Commission itself. As a consequence, the Great Commission becomes the Great Omission.

Nostalgia can be good. It can be fun and healthy. We certainly need to remember when. But we cannot live in the past, and we cannot re-create the past. The autopsy revealed a lot of nostalgia about the growth of the church. There was a lot of "remember when" about particular years of growing numbers and high attendance days. But members of dying churches often overlook the reason behind those years of growth and expansion. Thriving churches have the Great Commission as the center of their vision while dying churches have forgotten the clear command of Christ.

The Great Commission is Matthew 28:19-20: "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember I am with you always, to the end of the age. The imperative in those verses is "go". But as we go there are several sub-commands. We are to make disciples. We

are to baptize. We are to reach.

But in deceased churches somewhere in their history, they forgot to act upon the Great Commission. So they stopped going. And making disciples. And baptizing them. And reaching them.

You see, the Great Commission requires at least 2 points of obedience from church members They are to go, and they are to depend totally upon the power of Christ. That is why Jesus reminded them: "I am with you always." But the deceased church in its past stopped going. And it stopped depending on Christ.

Why? "Going" in Christ's power requires effort. Obedience is work. And obedience in His power means that we are praying to Jesus so we can reach others. That requires an "other" focus. That focus requires us to look beyond ourselves. That requires us to get uncomfortable. That requires us to go.

Dying churches choose not to remember what to do. They chose their own comfort over reaching others with the gospel. They wanted to same results as yesteryear, but they were not willing to expend the efforts. Remember the action words from Matthew 28? Go, make disciples, baptize and teach. They were not willing to expend the funds necessary for a vibrant outreach. They just wanted it to happen. Without prayer. Without sacrifice. Without hard work.

But here is the bigger issue. Even if the church began to grow on its own, the members of the dying church would only accept the growth if the new members were like them and if the church would continue to "do church" the way they wanted. Members of the dying churches really didn't want growth unless that growth met their preferences and allowed them to remain comfortable.

Prayer commitment: Lord, remind me that I am to be a Great Commission Christian in a Great Commission church. Remind me that, in Your strength, I am to do whatever it takes to reach out into my community with the transforming power of the gospel. Amen.


