The Autopsy of a Deceased Church by Thom S. Rainer

In the past few months every Bible Study of mine as well as Church Council and Staff have been studying a book entitled: The Autopsy of a Deceased Church by Thom S. Rainer. The book is about God's church. God cares about His church. God loves his church.

What we know today is that many churches are dying. Dr. Thom Rainer has helped churches reverse this trend and has "autopsied" those that have died. From his experience he discovered consistent themes among those churches that have died. It is not all doom and gloom because from those themes, lessons on how to keep our church alive and vibrant have emerged. Each month we will be reviewing some of his findings so that we can keep Grace Lutheran Church alive to the glory of God and continue to advance Christ's Kingdom! The following are excerpts from his book.

Chapter 9-The Church Rarely Prayed Together

Author Thom asked the question, Did the church members pray together? They paused. Sure, they said. The answer came, but not with much enthusiasm. So, Thom asked them to describe their prayer time. That's where the revelation would come. As they began to describe their prayer time it became evident that prayer had become routine or ritual.

It certainly would not have been the prayer of the New Testament times. When a church is engaging in meaningful prayer, it becomes both the cause and the result of greater church health. Prayer was the lifeblood of the early church.

What was discovered is that in the dying or deceased churches...there had been a time when prayer was powerful in their churches. They prayed intensely for the community and each other. "Then, he said, we became afraid." Many members sold their homes and got out as quickly as they could. The church started focusing on the fear. We stopped serving our community.

"And we stopped praying with the passion we once had. That's it. That was the beginning of the decline that led to our death. We stopped taking prayer seriously and the church started dying." No prayer. No hope. And the church started dying.

Chapter 10-The Church Had no Clear Purpose

In churches that are dying, former members referred to their last years in sad and similar ways:

We were going through the motions

Everything we did seemed to be like we were in a rut or bad routine.

We became more attached to our ways of doing church than we did asking the Lord what He wanted us to do.

We were playing a game called church. We had no idea what we were really supposed to be doing.

We stopped asking what we should be doing for fear that it would require too much effort or change.

None of the members talked about fulfilling the Great Commission. None of the spoke about carrying out the Great Commandment in the church. None ever came close to speaking with a burning passion about making a difference in the community.

The churches were purposeless. They were engaged in an activity called, "This is the way we have always done it." Paul in Phil. 1:3-5 shares in his letter to the Philippians:

3 I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now,

The church in this reading understood her purpose. The members at Philippi knew what they were supposed to do. They were to live the gospel. The were to proclaim the gospel. They were to partner with Paul in the gospel. Their purpose was totally and completely gospel-centered.

Notice that last line, "from the first day until now." The Philippian church members did not stop understanding their purpose. They knew what they were supposed to do. So they lived the gospel and they shared the gospel.

But the dying churches, at some point in their history, forgot their purpose. Rarely could they point to a singular event where the purpose was forgotten. It was a deadly and slow process. Attitudes shifted from gospel-centered and other-centered to self-centered. And outward focus became an inward obsession. Routines and traditions and rituals replace the original purpose of being a gospel-driven people. A church without a gospel-centered purpose is no longer a church at all.

Let us pray...God, reignite the hearts of our church members, including me, to have a passion for the gospel. Teach our church to share the gospel with others. Teach us to live as men and women who are true bearers of the good news of Jesus Christ. Remind us of our purpose. Convict us of our purpose. Empower us to live our purpose. Amen

What is all this touching in church? It used to be a person could come to church and sit in the pew and not be bothered by all this friendliness and certainly not by touching. I used to come to church and leave untouched. Now I have to be nervous about what is expected of me. I have to worry about responding to the person sit-



ting next to me. Oh, I wish it could be the way it used to be; I could just ask the person next to me: How are you? And the person could answer: Oh, just fine, and we'd both go home ... strangers who have known each other for twenty years. But now the minister asks us to pass the peace, the man next to me held my hand so tightly I wondered if he had been touched in years. Now I'm upset because the lady next to me cried and then apologized and said it was because I was so kind and that she needed a friend right now. Now I have to get involved. Now I have to suffer when this community suffers. Now I have to be more than a person coming to observe a service. That man last week told me I'd never know how much I'd touched his life. All I did was smile and tell him I understood what it was to be lonely. Lord, I'm not big enough to touch and be touched! The stretching scares me. What if I disappoint somebody? GREETINGS LIFT PARISH BOARD & COUNCIL MEMBERS!

It's been a busy second quarter in 2018! In April & May we had a trial period for Dinner Church. It was an exciting worship opportunity designed to meet the need of those that are unable to join in worship on Sunday mornings. We will have a planning meeting in early July to make plans for restarting Dinner Church this Fall.

While it would be easy to simply rest & relax because it's summer,

LIFT has been doing the opposite! LIFT and the Creating Healthy Communities coalition have paired up to help support the Vanguard Community Garden. This has been a fun opportunity to get our hands a little dirty and build connections through serving our community.

I have been volunteering with the Fremont City School's Free Summer Meal program where I have enjoyed getting to know some of the high school students participating in a leadership program and football players.

There is also an opportunity every Tuesday morning at 9:00am to walk and share in conversation with one another. You never know where God will lead our steps when we begin in prayer and a few verses from the Bible.

DISCIPLESHIP DEVELOPMENTS

Much of this quarter was spent on deepening and developing my personal discipleship. I attended a one day mini-retreat at Trinity Lutheran Seminary. This retreat was an opportunity to explore the Inner Gifts of discipleship and to identify a Bible story where I could see my spiritual journey being lived out.

I have also begun to participate in a Discipleship Coaching program. Through this program, I participate in a weekly video conference call with other ministry leaders from around the country. We are exploring together what discipleship means for each of us individually and how we might lead others to explore their own discipleship.

One of our early assignments was to develop our own definition for discipleship. Here is the definition that I settled on and have begun us-

ing to shape my ministry and work throughout the LIFT Parish.

Discipleship is a journey of embracing the call to recognize and share God's love in all of lifenot just on Sunday mornings or when we are with our "church" friends.

You'll see on the second page that this quarter's challenge is for you to develop your own discipleship definition.

OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Outreach can take many forms, but the most effective form is to simply be present and to build relationships. I recently stumbled upon this quote: "all the flowers of all the tomorrows are in the seeds of today". This is precisely what taking the time to build relationships allows for, it allows for seeds to be planted, for tend-

ing to the soil by listening to the needs, and for allowing a garden to blossom.

CHALLENGE ISSUED

NRSV:

¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

The Message: 18-20 Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age."
