Since then there has been a lot of misinformation about what that means for us as a church. LIFT HUNGER

Dear Friends in Christ,

Many of you may remember back in January on Martin Luther King's day the Lift Parish held a food packing event where over 100 of us packaged 40,000 Nutri-Plenty meals for Pack Away Hunger. Because that event was so energizing for the parish and helped to provide meals for children in Fremont and in Haiti, the Lift Parish decided to apply for Affiliate status with the Alliance for Better Nutrition, who provided the materials to pack these meals. As of August 9, 2019 the Lift Parish has been granted Affiliate status and are now commissioned to start packing meals for the entire Northeast corridor of the USA. For now this territory will be limited to a radius of a 5 hour drive from Fremont mostly in the northern and eastern direction. We are required to pack 250,000 meals in the next calendar year and it is my hope that we can reach a goal of packing 1,000,000 meals in 5 years. Think of the people that will be fed.

What I am asking for now is that if you are interested in being a part of this ministry that you contact me directly so that I can create a volunteer list for packing events within the Fremont area and a list of those willing to travel with me to do packing events away from home. We will be having a small meal packing event (2,000 meals), sometime in October on a Sunday evening as a demonstration of this ministry, and to answer any questions you may have. As volunteers you will be asked to do the following:

- Set up the meal packing assembly line for the event
- Tear down the event once completed.
- Haul away any trash from the event
- Help unload raw materials as they arrive for events
- Load a truck to take packing event on the road
- Assist with coordinating events as they come up
- Wash and store packing equipment after each event

Jesus cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

- John 7:37-38

If you travel to the Grand Canyon and hike along the rim in the desert you will find an interesting sign. It reads, "Stop! Drink water. You are thirsty, whether you realize it or not." It is a baffling idea to think that we may not recognize our own thirst. But we human beings know that it is very possible to be so preoccupied living, working, checking off our to-do-list, that we forget to nourish our bodies. More than once I have come home from a busy day to suddenly discover, "I am thirsty". I am not alone, 75% of Americans don't get enough water to drink each day. Three out of four of us walk around in a chronic state of dehydration and we don't even realize it.

The same can happen in our faith lives. A sign could be posted for us in the dry places cautioning, "Stop! Drink water. You are thirsty, whether you realize it or not." Sometimes I think the Holy Spirit suddenly makes us aware of our thirst for a reason. Realizing your thirst is a gift. It allows you to seek a source of abundant nourishment.

Four years ago we began Diakonia (pronounced dee-ak-on-ee'-ah) in the Southeastern Conference of our synod. We noticed that there were lay leaders in our congregations thirsty for deeper understanding, so we gathered teachers and learners together and brought the Diakonia Program here to Northwestern Ohio. **This year, Diakonia is expanding, including a new class in the North Central and Eastern Conferences.** Diakonia is a call to discipleship. It gathers Christians together to grow and learn in order to more fully respond to the call to serve Christ. The curriculum consists of twelve courses, with six courses offered each academic year. Each course has five sessions in three-hour increments. Starting in September, courses will be offered at St. John's Lutheran Church, 212 N. Clover St. on Thursday nights from 6 - 9 p.m. There are six courses available - each taught by a different local rostered minister. Students come from many different congregations. Weekly reading assignments and reflections are designed to relate to the topic of study and stir conversation. Tuition is \$60 per course. Scholarships are available for all those in need of assistance. A "meet the teachers" potluck and orientation is set for **September 3 at 6 p.m.** Sign up at:https://nwos-diakonia.weebly.com/.

CHICAGO — Gathering under the theme "We are church," voting members of the 2019 Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) made a number of key decisions to further the mission and ministry of this church. The assembly, the chief legislative authority of the church, met Aug. 5-10 at the Wisconsin Center in Milwaukee.

More than 900 voting members:

- Reelected on the first ballot the Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton to a six-year term as ELCA presiding bishop.
- Elected Deacon Sue Rothmeyer to a six-year term as ELCA secretary. Rothmeyer, currently serving as executive for administration with the Office of the Secretary, was installed during the assembly's closing worship on Aug. 10 and will begin her term Nov. 1.
- Approved the social statement "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Call to Action" and its implementing resolutions. The social statement, in part, names patriarchy and sexism as sins and calls the church to action on a range of issues, including gender-based violence, workplace discrimination and economic inequality.
- Adopted "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment," which will serve as church policy for inter-religious relations. The policy statement was adopted with the witness of 39 ecumenical and inter-religious guests in attendance.
- Approved the triennium budget for 2020-2022, which includes a current fund spending authorization of \$68,378,325 for 2020, a current fund income proposal of \$68,442,034 for 2021 and \$68,507,018 for 2022; and an ELCA World Hunger spending authorization of \$21.5 million 2020, and an income proposal of \$21.5 million for 2021 and for 2022.
- Adopted the "Strategy Toward Authentic Diversity in the ELCA," which consists of a report and recommendations on how the ELCA exhibits authentic diversity and formulates goals for racial diversity and inclusion.
- Witnessed the presentation of the "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent," which was accepted by the Rev. Lamont A. Wells, president of the African Descent Lutheran Association (ADLA), and members of ADLA.
- Adopted 26 memorials en bloc, ranging in topics from gun violence to engagement in the Holy Land and gender identity to seminary tuition.

Adopted a memorial that affirms the ELCA's long-standing commitment to migrants and refugees and declares the ELCA a sanctuary church body.

Assembly continued.

- Adopted a memorial that calls for the development of a social statement and social message on the relationship of church and state.
- Adopted a memorial to encourage all synods and congregations to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the ELCA's ordination of women in 2020, the 40th anniversary of the ordination of women of color in the Lutheran tradition and the 10th anniversary of the ELCA's decision to remove barriers to ordination for people in same-gender relationships.
- Adopted a memorial to support the vision and goals of the Poor People's Campaign that align with the ELCA's social teachings.
- Adopted a series of amendments to the "Constitutions, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America," including one that makes ordination the entrance rite for ministers of Word and Service, and an amendment to no longer count deacons as laypeople for representational principles.
- Adopted a resolution that committed the ELCA to support the World Council of Church's "Thursdays in Black" campaign toward a world without rape and violence.
- Adopted a resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance in the ELCA for the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9—the nine people who were shot and killed June 17, 2015, during a Bible study at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C.
- Adopted a resolution to condemn white supremacy, calling all ELCA congregations
 to engage in a "study of the structures and rhetoric that empower and fuel racism and
 white supremacy and to take to heart the teaching of Scriptures, so we may all be
 better equipped to speak boldly about the equal dignity of all persons in the eyes of
 God."
- Celebrated the end of Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA, which concluded June 30 with nearly \$250 million raised in cash, multiyear commitments and planned gift commitments. At the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, voting members approved the \$198 million campaign to help sustain and grow ministries of the church.
- Elected members to serve on the ELCA Church Council, churchwide committees and churchwide boards, including Portico Benefit Services, the Mission Investment Fund and 1517 Media.




NOISY OFFERING UPDATE


