Grace Lutheran Church Capital Campaign Project List - Approved at Annual Congregational Meeting, February 3, 2019

The following is the list of projects that Church Council has been discussing and working on for the past couple of years. We anticipate that the campaign would run for 2-3 years and we would start individual projects as funds are available. We have a \$125,000 commitment from the Endowment Board (25% in 2019, 25% in 2020, and 50% in 2021) and we have identified \$175,000 from our back page accounts that could be utilized, for a total of \$300,000 committed to the projects.

- Purchase computer software for boiler heating system to improve efficiency and reduce manual override during unscheduled events (includes training)

MY NEW NORMAL - PART 2

My new normal started on July 26th with my first round of chemotherapy. The chemo infusion itself was not that bad. I know that my body does not respond well to drugs of any kind, but my oncologist told me that everything would be fine. By the evening of the first night...my body started to ache.

During the first infusion and for a few days after, I was given 9 drugs. Well my body did not appreciate all the chemicals going through my system! By day 10 I was finally able to rouse myself out of the recliner. I would have 11 days to recover before my next round of chemo.

The day came for my next infusion. Since I was not 100%, I was delayed a week. I was delighted that my body was given more time to heal. I returned on 8/23 ready to face my next round of chemo. Unfortunately, the side effects were even worse! I ended up in the Cleveland Clinic Hospital for 3 days. My body developed colitis from the drugs. Only 2% of people that take chemo have this kind of reaction. I knew that I was special Lord in your eyes...but really? I had quite the conversation with the Lord that day...

One never knows what we will face in our life. On 9/24 we will be putting together the next steps in my treatment plan. 15 radiation treatments. A pill added for breast cancer survivors for the next 5 years. I ponder my prognosis. What will be the consequences of receiving only 2 of the 4 chemo treatments? My faith rests in the Lord! I am a blessed child of God and it will be good.

My life has changed forever. Cancer changes your life. Nothing is ever the same again. I will never be "cured." If we allow it, it can control our thoughts, disrupting us from living the abundant life Christ came to give us. If you or a loved one is facing cancer, know that God hasn't forgotten you. That God loves each one of you.

I would like each of you to know there is always Good News. No matter what we face in life...there is always Good News! In Isaiah 41:10 we read:

¹⁰ So do not fear, for I am with you;
do not be dismayed, for I am your God.
I will strengthen you and help you;
I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

I give thanks to God for each one of you. Your kindness and love have been a blessing for myself and my family. Thank you for all the prayers, cards, calls and emails. What a blessing you have been for us. Thank you, my friends. And I thank God! No matter what I face, I know that God is with me.


LIFT DIRECTOR OF DISCIPLESHIP & OUTREACH SNAPSHOT - October 2019

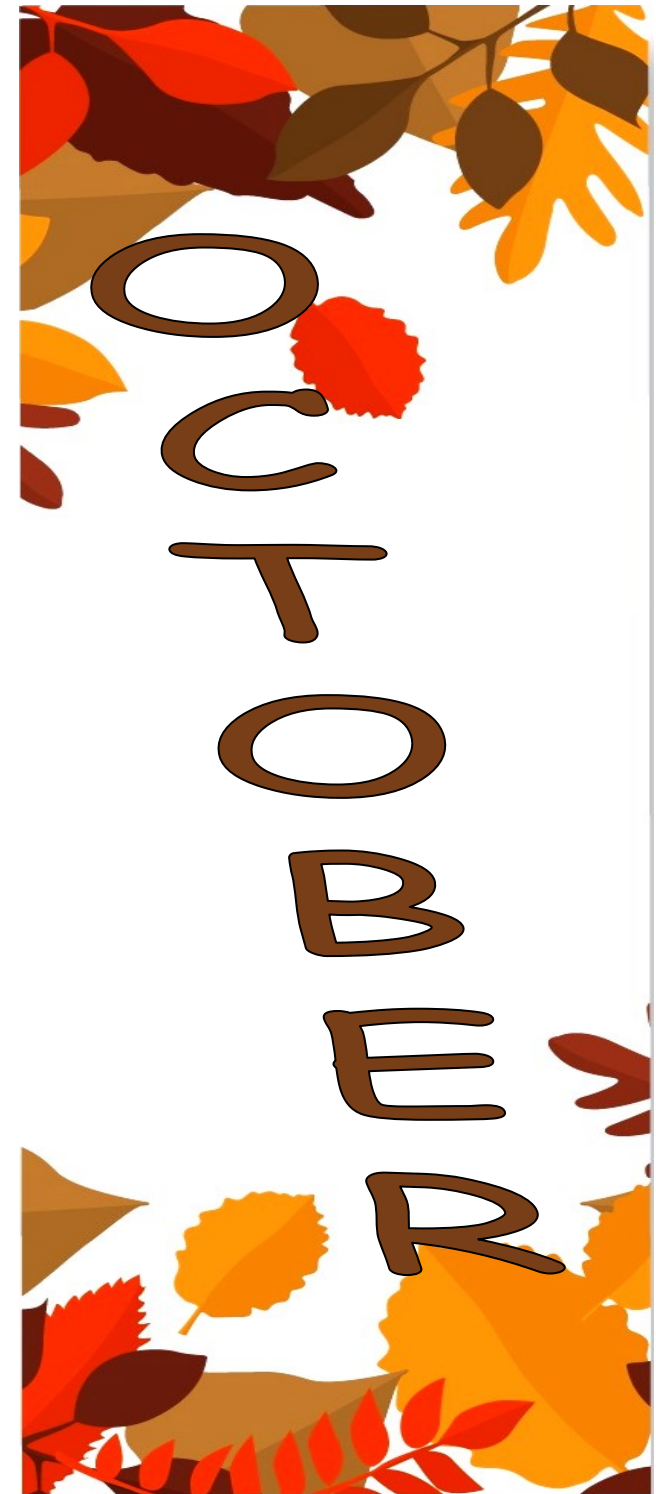
