My New Normal -Part 3

What a journey! Never in my life did I expect to have cancer, but one never knows what challenges life will bring!

As most of you know, I started my 15 radiation treatments at the main campus of Cleveland Clinic on Thursday, Oct. 10. I hoped to go to Sandusky for my treatments, but then I would have been required to have 25! That was enough of a reason to go to Cleveland for me!

I still will have appointments with my breast surgeon, my oncologist, the radiologist and the surgeon who connected my lymphatic system to my vascular surgeon (the chief plastic surgeon at CC). There will be many more trips, but I am past all the difficult portions.

When you go to Cleveland for radiation, you go to the basement level of the Taussig Cancer Building. I think they want to keep all those radiation beams contained! We all sign in and then proceed to a room where you change into a hospital gown. Mostly women are in the wing, but a few men are there as well primarily to support their loved ones.

The women in the waiting area become a spiritual group of caring and loving one another. We all share our stories of what kind of breast cancer we have and where we are in the process. There are many bald heads in the room!

It is such a blessing for me. I know that my faith rests in the Lord and I am a blessed child of God. As all of the women visit, you find so many people with such great faith! Wow!!

I met a woman yesterday who has a very aggressive breast cancer. Most women with this form of cancer do not survive very long. She just kept thanking God that he had seen her through this far....and she knew God would continue. She believes in miracles. When she left, she gave me the biggest hug and kiss and thanked me for talking with her and sharing our faith stories!

Every single person's life in that building has been changed forever. We walk together and share our stories offering hope through Jesus.

None of us will be "cured," we will just be in remission. For any person in that building, cancer can control their thoughts, disrupting them from living the abundant life Christ came to give us. If you or a loved one is facing cancer or any other life threatening disease, know that God hasn't forgotten you. God loves each one of you.

I pray that this journey is soon over for me. That I too will celebrate my cancer in remission. It has been a long and hard journey, but one made a little easier by each of you. You have all been so kind, thoughtful and loving...thank you for allowing me to be your pastor. Thanks to God for sending me to Fremont, Ohio!

A SERVICE OF LESSONS AND CAROLS WILL BE SUNG ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 1 at 4:00 p.m.

Advent – the word means coming or arrival – is a season which has two meanings for Christians. It is a time to prepare for the anniversary of the Jesus Christ's first coming - his birth to the Blessed Virgin Mary at Bethlehem two thousand years ago and culminates in our celebration of Christmas, the twelve-day feast that lasts from December 25 to January 6. The other theme of Advent is the Second Coming of our Lord at the end of time, when he will come in great power and glory to judge both the living and the dead. The double emphasis on both the first and the second advents of Christ gives to the season its unique mixture of devotional joy: joy in the redemption that has come to us in the Incarnation, and awe before the Judgment that yet awaits us. To the spiritually discerning believer, both of these tremendous and signal events of past and future are experienced as eternally present realities.

Advent is a season of both quiet reflection and joyful expectation. This service is intended to be a time of spiritual preparation, as we watch and wait for the coming of the Kingdom of God. Through our experience of sacred Word and music, the story of the coming of Christ gradually unfolds and deepens our understanding of God's message of love and redemption. The liturgy itself embodies the sense of Advent movement --- through the choir's processions and in the increasingly powerful prophecies and promises of Holy Scripture. May these words and this music propel you quietly toward the true joy of Christmas.

Behind the Scenes

Dear Friends in Christ,

The two questions I often hear around the church-house, from those who don't know what exactly LIFT is, are "What is Lift?" and "What do you do all day for Lift" Therefore I have decided to write a monthly blog to be included in the Newsletters of all Lift participating churches.

Before going into those two questions I would like to explain my approach to being church together in Fremont. I believe that being church is about two things and only two things.

The Great Commandment "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matt 22:36-40)

The Great Commission "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." (Matt 28:19-20)

The task for every church and every disciple of Jesus is how do we work this out in our context. This is what the staff of the Lift Parish works on everyday of our work week.

So, "What is Lift?" Living In Faith Together (LIFT) is an exciting family of churches working together as Christians in Fremont Ohio! Each campus is distinctly different yet one body in Christ. It's a group of churches who share resources and leadership to accomplish our two main goals.

The harder question is "What do you do all day for Lift". For the most part the answer is easy, Attend Meetings. I know that sounds mundane, but that is where most of our ministry gives birth. It is where visions are cast, details get hashed out, and where the nuts and bolts of ministry get put together. This is the result"

Can you remember the last time you blew bubbles? What about a bubble that is bigger than your face? On September 21st the joy expressed from blowing bubbles was quite the draw during the Street Play Saturday Farmer's Market! New this year we distributed recipe cards to help families create bubble blowing memories of their own at home. It was great to see familiar faces and meet new families, especially those

wearing the LIFT Fall Soccer League shirts.

GREETINGS LIFT PARISH BOARD & COUNCIL MEMBERS!

The Evangelism Table approved **sponsorship** of the Fall Soccer League through the Fremont Parks & Recreation Department. This sponsorship is just one small way of letting the youth and families of our community know that they are supported by the many members of LIFT!

LIFT Outdoor Worship Service was enjoyed by nearly 350 worshippers from the community, LIFT congregations and the members of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. We returned to the Sandusky County Fairgrounds but utilized a new location on the grounds which allowed ample space for those who chose to worship in their vehicles. The fellowship time before the service was a great success as many enjoyed the donuts and coffee provided!

DISCIPLESHIP DEVELOPMENTS

The **Discipleship Group** is continuing to explore how hospitality is experienced throughout the congregations of LIFT, specifically the welcome received when attending worship. The group will meet into the early months of 2020 and we look forward to sharing our suggestions to make LIFT a community overflowing with hospitality.

I recently completed an intensive learning course titled: "Your **Congregation as a School of Love.**" This will greatly influence the small groups offered in 2020, the sermons you'll hear from me and the emphasis for next year's Discipleship Group. I'm looking forward to starting this with our Fall Season of Dinner Church focusing on how 1 Corinthians 13 isn't just a text to be shared at wedding services.

You may have noticed that Faith Pause is no longer meeting. Due to a decrease of interest in the opportunity, I have switched to leading a book club. A small group recently completed Bob Goff's Everybody Always. Through conversation we discovered that living like Jesus doesn't require more than simply being present to those around us and seeing what sharing love can do to change lives in big ways. QUARTERLY REPORT FOR LIFT COUNCIL MEMBERS

OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

LIFT is present in many places throughout the community as a reminder that God's love isn't limited to the inside of any of our church buildings' walls. As 2019 comes to a close we will be very visible as our **support for Community Christmas** increases this year. You'll see Grace Lutheran Church become one of the locations where applications can be returned. I will also be visiting the Senior Centers in Gibsonburg, Clyde and Fremont to help seniors over age 65 complete applications for assistance. A number of LIFT members will volunteer throughout the weeks leading up to the distribution on December 19th and many will spend the day helping families load gifts into their vehicles. This year we have a specific need for volunteers to help direct traffic at Terra, assist those utilizing Handicap Parking, and 2 individuals to deliver items to the Genacross apartments in Gibsonburg. If you are interested in participating as a volunteer, please contact me directly and will be sure you are included on our volunteer lists!

VISION FOR OCTOBER-DECEMBER 2019

During this quarter I will have been serving alongside each of you for just over two years! If you quiz me, I may be able to tell you what congregation you worship with and if we're lucky your name. Looking ahead to 2020 will be the primary focus of my time in this last quarter of the year. I will be selecting the next two books for the book

club, working on the plan for discipleship group, crafting a sermon to weave the shared journey of LIFT throughout all of next year, and developing a new format for our Online Bible Study.

Much of December will be spent facilitating Community Christmas and then planning out my work rhythm for the New Year. Effective February 3, 2020 I will add another title to my professional career : **Executive Director for** Sandusky County Habitat for Humanity. In order to still allow time with my family, I will decrease my hours slightly with LIFT to assume this part time role. Please know that this change will not impact the presence LIFT has in the community or the

ongoing discipleship work found within our congregations. You may see me a little less frequently on Sunday mornings in each of the LIFT churches as I focus on being present for Lucy as she begins her faith journey with Sunday School. I give thanks for the prayers you offer as I work to balance this additional calling!

CHALLENGE ISSUED

As you prepare for the holiday season, consider the opportunity to volunteer your time or in some other way share out of your abundance to bless someone else. Think about the love and joy we will all share in on Christmas Eve as we celebrate the birth of Jesus.
