I Have a Dream!

At our Church Council meeting last Monday night, we held a slightly different conversation than our norm. The previous week the Executive group met and decided it was time to have a "Come to Jesus Meeting" with all our leaders.

We reread the book, "Autopsy of a Deceased Church: 12 Ways to Keep Yours Alive" by Thom Rainer. Conversation was held to help council realize that perhaps it was time to think about something new.

We reviewed all the statistics:

- Attendance declined every month in 2019
- From our last pictorial directory, we have lost 160 members (of just those pictured)-93 to death or moving to nursing homes, 20 have moved, 25 youth who went to college, and others.
- Giving has remarkably remained about the same as previous years

We first thought that perhaps the 9 am service contributed. Actually, attendance was declining before we changed to one service in July 2019.

What we discovered is that we might just need to do something different....and we began to Dream. Some in the group thought that we should expand our Noah's Ark preschool and maybe even add a kindergarten. We are just starting to research this idea with the help of Tricia McElfresh and the state regulators. There maybe a great need, but we will research all aspects and bring this to the church if a viable option.

Others thought that we should begin to reach out! Our first endeavor will be to contact all the members who have not been attending recently. We want to reach out and see if they are well...if they would like to return.

Future down the road...helping all members become comfortable with inviting others to come and share the love of Christ at Grace Lutheran Church. All of this will take time, but if we all "Have a Dream" for where God is leading us together...well then anything is possible.

We ask for your prayers as we continue to stop and listen for the Holy Spirit. May God always bless us in our ministry together.

Do Not Be Afraid!

"A young man dressed in a white robe . . . said, 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter . . . '" (Mark 16:5-7).

"Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid" (Mark 16:8).

Tho wouldn't tremble and be afraid! You go to anoint a body to prepare it for a proper burial, but the body is missing. Then some ethereal creature tells you the body isn't there because it is no longer dead but alive. Who could take it in? "Don't be alarmed" the man in white said. Yeah, right!

Yet, looking back, perhaps the women remembered the thousands he had fed with only two fish and five loaves of bread (Matthew 14:15-21). Maybe they thought again

Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brothers . . . '" (Matthew 28:9-10).



Jesus' last command is the same as this one: Don't be afraid. Go and tell. We can understand the fear of the women at the empty tomb. What are we afraid of? Trouble? Or hardship? Persecution? Or famine? Nakedness? Or danger? Or sword? There is no fear in these things! "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us" (Romans 8:35, 37). We have the benefit of history. The women at the tomb couldn't fathom the outcome, but we have God's Word that assures us of our victory in Christ. We have his promise, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). So don't be afraid! Go and tell!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!



Ask yourself: Do you ever find time for the work of God? There is a wide choice of things which you can do for God and neighbor, in and through your church community - if you have the good will. With goodwill you also will find the necessary time for such projects, even though you may have to cut and pare in other directions.


