

BURNING OUESTION

When will we be back in the sanctuary for in person worship? We are being asked this question often. We understand why many members are asking. We see people in stores, movie theaters, at other churches, at the gym, and out and about, and we wonder why we can not be in the sanctuary for worship. We all want to come back into the sanctuary for worship and are praying that will be soon. Our bishop, Daniel Beaudoin, has advised congregations in the Northwest Ohio Synod to not worship in person in order to keep our members safe during this pandemic. We put a Covid-19 policy in place when this pandemic color chart started and we plan to stay the course, which is to worship virtually and at car church when the color is red. When we go orange, which we pray is soon, we



will come back into the sanctuary for in person worship. Keep in mind that it will take time to inform our members and get the safety procedures in place when we do go orange. Since Governor DeWine does the color updates on Thursday afternoons, we will delay one week coming back into the sanctuary. To be clear. When Sandusky county moves to the color orange, we will wait one week to come back into the sanctuary. We all want to come back into our sanctuary for worship. Please be patient and understand that we are doing what we believe is the safest practice for everyone. We will come back together in the sanctuary and we are all praying it happens very soon.



FROM THE LIFT PASTOR

In my first weeks as pastor of LIFT, I have enjoyed jumping into ministry here in Fremont and getting to make connections with folks here. My family and I are very appreciative of the very generous welcome basket we received. Thank you so much.

As we move into the season of Lent, our Wednesday night services will focus on the five mission priorities of LIFT. This list had been compiled by the LIFT board, and I think it is a helpful set of values to help us clarify and continue our ministry. We'll have some conversations to get us thinking and reflecting about how we live out our faith in our daily lives. Here are some of my initial reflections as I think about each point.

Present in our Community: As people of faith, our mission starts at home. Like trees planted by water, we are rooted in place. The Church becomes not a destination that people travel to on Sundays, but an outpost for discipleship. It's about relationship and connections. This might mean attending events at local schools and neighborhoods. It means being intentional about knowing the place where we serve.

Witnessing to God's Love: Sometimes people joke that Lutherans are shy to share about our faith. Perhaps because our theology is so grace-filled and focused on love instead of fear, it doesn't always seem urgent or pressing. But we need not be afraid to tell people about how God has been present in our lives. With our words and our actions, we can model what Christ is all about.

Hearing the Needs: As we care for other people, we do not just care about their souls, but rather, we also care about physical needs here and now. Through ministries like the LIFT Mercy Fund and the Bridge of Hope food pantry, we help address real hunger. This also means we have to be intentional about listening to those around us and including other voices in the conversations.

Serving our Neighbor: The life of Christian discipleship is not just about me and Jesus. It's about all humanity. We focus not only on ourselves, but when we make decisions, we need to take into account how it impacts others. Martin Luther talked about being little Christs to one another.


Striving for Justice: When the Bible talks about justice, it's communal and collective. When the Bible talks about justice, it's about how society treats people often marginalized: orphans, widows, foreigners. Biblical justice is less about punitive punishment, giving people what they deserve. Rather, it's about God's abundance, giving more than anyone deserves. More grace, more forgiveness, more reconciliation. Justice calls us to ask big and challenging questions: Why are people poor in the first place? Why is their inequality and division in our world?

As your new LIFT Pastor, I look forward to more conversation. I'm eager to continue working together in this ministry with all of you.



Sharing God's Bounty

The Name that Is Above Every Name

bedience has become an almost ignored concept. Some parents believe that requiring obedience from their children stifles their creative and emotional development. Many couples remove the word "obey" from the vows that brides give to their grooms. To expect employees to obey their employers is certainly not acceptable.

To God, however, obedience is not only acceptable, it is required. Disobedience to God is what is known as sin. And sin separates. Sin separates us from God and from each other. Sin prevents us from living the abundant life that Christ came to give us (John 10:10). On the other hand, obedience is proof of love: "If you love me, you will obey what I command," Jesus says (John 14:15).



Unfortunately, as sinful beings, we are unable to obey our Lord's commands fully. Even the great apostle Paul struggled with this reality. He confessed, "I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out" (Romans 7:18). As he relates his dilemma – the dilemma all Christians face – he asks, "Who will rescue me from this body of death?" (For as surely as day follows night, death follows disobedience) He answers exultantly, "Thanks be to God – through Jesus Christ our Lord!" (Romans 7:24-25)

Jesus has lived the perfect life in our place. Jesus willingly emptied himself, made himself nothing, "and became obedient to death – even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name" (Philippians 2:7-9).

Jesus did what we cannot do. Jesus triumphed over sin, death, and the devil. Jesus, dead and buried, would not stay there! Jesus has risen! He is exalted to the highest place! He has given us his Spirit, the Counselor, who lives with us and in us (John 14:16-17), to sanctify us for obedience to our Father and service to others. This Spirit equips and enables us to be faithful stewards of the Gospel and all his gifts. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!



Christian Stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities, and material possessions based on the conviction that these are a trust from God, to be used in God's service for the benefit of all mankind in grateful acknowledgement of Christ's redeeming love.


