As we move toward summer, I highlight some of LIFT's activities, using as a framework the list of five mission priorities from our mission statement.

**1. Present in our community** - Plans are in the works for a huge LIFT event on Thursday, August 12–a giant block party. The idea emerged from the My Brother's Keeper group at Grace, but it quickly became clear that it would have more impact as a LIFT event. On behalf of LIFT, we have applied for a synod micro grant to help fund this outreach opportunity. There will be a DJ, school supply give away, bounce house, hotdogs, and more. It will culminate with an outdoor worship service in the style of car church. Many hands from all our congregations will be needed to make this a success.

**2. Witnessing to God's love** - Worship is LIFT's primary way of proclaiming God's love. Three months of drive-in car church gave me a chance for some good collegial teamwork with the pastoral and music leaders from the congregations. As COVID precautions have changed, our congregations have been returning to in-person worship. As the primary pastoral leader for Trinity and St. Mark, I began preaching at Trinity (in the shop building of the Wiekerts) on April 11 at 8:30 a.m. and at St. Mark on Sundays at 9:45 a.m., starting April 18. I write a weekly devotion for the Thursday LIFT email that Becca Myers sends out. I have begun recording a video version that I post on Facebook.

**3. Hearing the needs** - We've had an increase in requests for the Mercy Fund, with three just this week. Each weekday, the pastors of LIFT congregations take turns calling the hospital in Fremont to find out what Lutherans are hospitalized each day. We then pass on that info to our colleagues.

**4. Serving our neighbor** - Bridge of Hope continues to operate a food pantry at Hayes. It is open on Mondays from five until 6:30 p.m. Ashley Wynn is the new director, who brings significant experience in business management, nonprofit work, and faith communities.

**5. Striving for justice** - A reminder: Justice is more than preaching about social issues. It's about matching our practices with our beliefs. Part of that includes equitable compensation for people who create the resources we use. It's not legal or ethical just to photocopy songs for them now and put them in the bulletin. We do need to pay a license and report our usage. The LIFT congregations share licenses together, and Tricia Dabrunz at Grace is responsible for reporting what hymns are sung in our congregations each week.

## Sharing God's Bounty

### **Overcoming Pride**

n his book *Mere Christianity*, C. S. Lewis wrote the following about pride: "Pride is the one vice of which no man in the world is free; which everyone in the world loathes when he sees it in someone else; and of which hardly any people, except Christians, ever imagine they are guilty of themselves." We demonstrate pride when go our own way and do our own thing. It is "my will be done" not "thy will be done."

Pride is sinful and destructive. It destroys gratitude to God for all his kindness to us. It destroys our desire and ability to serve others. It destroys contentment for it feeds our competitive nature so that we are not satisfied with just being wealthy or intelligent, but we want to be wealthier and more intelligent than anyone else.

Through faith, we are changed by God from being self-serving, proud people into people who are humble and seek the welfare of others before ourselves. God changes us from being people who always want to be in control into people who desire to be controlled by God. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth" (Matthew 5:5). In Rick Warren's book The Purpose Driven Life, he wrote, "Humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less."



Through faith, we understand our need for humility. We become more humble as God molds and transforms us by the renewing of our mind (Romans 12:2).

Pride has no place in our lives as Christians and stewards. First Peter 5:6 reads, "Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand that he may lift you up in due time." It is God alone who can exalt us (Psalm 75:7). If Christ himself, God's only begotten Son, humbled himself, should we not follow his example and humble ourselves? Because Christ humbled himself, God exalted him (Philippians 2:9)

David, the shepherd-king, put our situation in proper perspective: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, the son of man that you care for him?" (Psalm 8:3-4). The inference is that, although we are insignificant, God has exalted us: "You made [us] ruler over the works of your hands; you put everything under [our] feet."

Humility allows us to accept our smallness and God's goodness. Humility is the decision to "let God be God." We are stewards through humility. We are to honor him with what we have, what we are, and what he will make of us.



Let us be generous with gifts we can give to others: Time, Good Example, Acceptance, Seeing the Best in People, Self-esteem, Self-disclosure, Helping Someone Learn Something New, Listening, Fun, Letting Others Give to You.
