A Note From Pastor Mark

I hope your summer is going well. Summers are good for lots of things -- vacations, boating and other water activities like swimming, and staying caught up with yard work and projects around the house. During these extra hot days, I'm thankful for modern inventions such as air conditioning. When I was a kid growing up in Minnesota, the place to be on those steamy summer days was Larson's grocery store on Main Street, one of the few places in town that had such an amenity.

Summers are good for lots of things, but especially for making memories. Fifty years later, I still have vivid memories of family vacations to the Black Hills and Mount Rushmore, and to Duluth and the North Shore of Lake Superior, where we toured the giant ore boats, and I listened to my dad engage some Swedish sailors in conversation, using the language that he grew up speaking, Norwegian.

Summers are also great opportunities to create what I would call faith-based memories. These are memories that help us to experience the presence and reality of God. I've heard it said that memories are the milestones by which we mark our journeys with God. When Paul wrote his second letter to Timothy, you can tell that Paul is encouraging him to draw from a rich portfolio of memories: "Now you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions and suffering the things that happened to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. What persecutions I endured! Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them." (2 Timothy 3:10-11)

What this means, among other things, is that we significantly impact people, especially children and youth, by creating vivid memories through which they watch, hear, see, or are touched by God at work.

Over the years I have been a pastor, I have had many opportunities to create memories with and for young people, as we have traveled and experienced camps, mission trips, overnight and weekend retreats, weeks at Lakeside, and national youth gatherings. Most of those memories have been sublime, but others have been learning experiences in patience and perseverance. Several of the more memorable ones include a church van that broke down at inopportune times, or being stuck in a stalled subway in Atlanta, causing us to miss an evening program at the National Youth Gathering.

I am sure that many positive memories have been and will be created this summer. As I write this, Grace's youth director, Heather, is leading a group of congregation and community children and youth in group activities at Wendel Miller Park and Bike Trail, one of many activity days scheduled this summer for what we are calling "Summer Park Tour."

Other events that will create memories this summer will be LIFT sponsored Vacation Bible School at Hayes United Methodist Church. Our theme will be "To Mars and Beyond," so it will be very much an "out of this world" experience! On Thursday, August 12, LIFT is sponsoring a Block Party from 3-7pm, and will feature a car show, a bounce house, free food, a DJ playing your favorite tunes, free school supplies, and an outdoor worship service. Hope you can make it -- bring your camera, and capture the memories!

I certainly hope that this summer will be a memorable one, and that your experiences and memories of it will capture the grace and the goodness of God.

Interim Update

Reported by Pastor Mark

On Monday, July 12, I met from 5:30 - 8:30 pm with members of Council and the Transition Team for a time of learning about the Interim Process and how it will unfold at Grace. We began with a box supper and a brief Council meeting to approve essential reports. Our time together continued as we reviewed the stages, tasks, and focus points of the interim time, which are all the work of the congregation.

We reviewed a blank Ministry Site Profile, the multi-page document that will describe Grace to potential pastoral candidates, including the gifts, talents and abilities that you believe your new pastor will need.

We viewed a video presentation by Dr. Peter Steinke, a leadership consultant who has served as a parish pastor, therapist, and is the founder of the organization Healthy Congregations. Dr. Steinke speaks of the congregation as an emotional system, and the importance of managing in positive ways times of anxiety in the congregation.

Finally, I presented some biblical and theological concepts using an essay that was written by Dr. Timothy Wengert, former professor at United Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, who outlined three areas which must shape our future as congregations, synods, and a national church body: Our commitment to the Bible, the centrality of worship, and the witness to the gospel as shaped by our Lutheran Confessions.

At the end of our session I met with members of the Transition Team to schedule our first meeting, which will be Thursday, July 22. The Transition Team will be gathering information about the community and input from congregation members over the next five to six months, so they will be able to complete a Ministry Site Profile which will as much as possible reflect the heart and will of the congregation regarding the kind of leader that is needed at Grace for the next stage of your life together.

Members of the Transition Team are: Ed Muffler, Larry McElfresh, Michael Amor, Beth Muffler, Becky Seibert, Jean Dupey, and Peggy Kiser. Keep them in your prayers. You will be hearing more from them in the coming weeks and months.

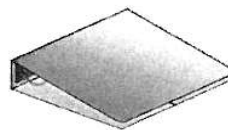

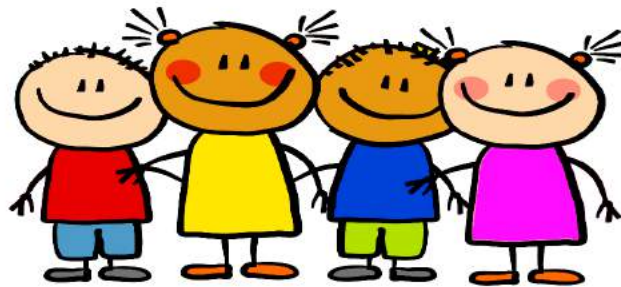

Sharing God's Bounty

The Importance of Giving

It is not uncommon for church members to perceive in a negative way the encouragement from their church to give generously. The perception of some people is that the church is only interested in their money. Certainly, a generous giving congregation does provide the money needed by the church for its budget so the church should work hard to help people grow in their giving. However, Scripture indicates that giving is as much for the sake of the giver as it is to support the needs of the church. Pastors and church leaders understand that giving is an activity that God directs us to do. Jesus said, *"Freely you have received, freely give"* (Matthew 10:8). Paul wrote to the Church in Corinth about the collection for God's people, *"On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income. . ."* (1 Corinthians 16:2).



Giving blesses both the giver and the recipient of the giving. The blessings to the recipients are obvious. Not as obvious but as important to understand is that giving enriches the life of the giver. Giving strengthens the relationship that we have with our Lord. Through our giving, we are reminded of God's ownership and how dependent we are on him. Giving demonstrates our faith and trust. We give as part of our worship. Giving allows us to be used by God in partnership with him.

In God's Word, we are told that those who give faithfully and generously will receive even more of God's blessings. In Proverbs 3:9 we read these encouraging words, *"Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing. . ."* God blesses all people, but he wants to bless us even more for our faithful giving. *"One man give freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty"* (Proverbs 11:24). Generosity is the path to blessing. By contrast, a stingy person doesn't make any friends and hurts himself in the long run. Through the prophet Malachi, we are told again how God will bless us for our faithful giving, *"Bring the whole tithe in the storehouse that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have enough room for it!"* (Malachi 3:10).

In the future, we need to thank church leaders who encourage us to grow in our giving. Through our giving, we are expressing thanks to God for his goodness to us. We are also helping to extend God's kingdom through our church, providing for the needy, and enriching our own lives. As we grow spiritually and receive more of God's blessings, we will better understand and respond to the encouragement to increase our giving.

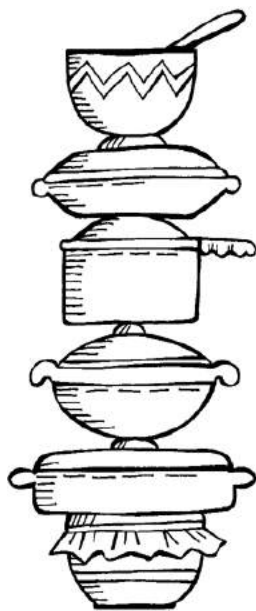

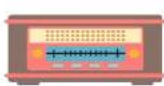
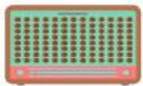
