

Stewardship Team Leading Fall Campaign

By now, I hope you have received and read the first letter of our fall Stewardship Campaign, "Live Generously." The Stewardship Team, composed of Tanya Schling, Henry Seibert, Kent Watkins, Kathleen Burmeister, and Maureen Pump, has chosen this theme because we believe that God has been exceedingly generous with us, by giving us the gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. This frees us to be exceedingly generous in our daily lives, so that we offer with joy and thanksgiving what God has first given us, ourselves, our time and our possessions.



In our campaign we are learning to tell "Impact stories," or "outcome stories" or "generosity stories," all of which focus on how we have experienced generosity in our lives and the impact of those experiences on our lives. Do you have a story to tell? We'd love to hear from you!

You will soon receive another letter as a part of this campaign that will include an "Intent Card." When you receive this letter and card, I and the team hope that you will prayerfully consider how you might express generosity in your giving to Grace in 2022. You will be encouraged to return this card the weekend of November 13-14, or place it in the mail to the church office.

Grace member Henry Seibert, a member of the Stewardship Team, shares below a story of how he was inspired to greater generosity.

Generosity and Joy

Dr. Fred Meuser, former President of Trinity Seminary was my teacher, mentor, friend and preacher at my Ordination fifty years ago. One time at a stewardship presentation at Lakeside he said, "Give until your heart is overrun with joy. Give until your heart is full of joy. Give until it feels good."

I equate that with the words of Jesus in John 15 where He says, "If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." (John 15:10-11)

Imagine the joy of Jesus filling your heart. Imagine giving in gratitude for the gift of eternal life given to you in your baptism. Imagine taking up residence in the love of Jesus. In the love of Jesus you find home base, the place out of which you operate, move, speak, do, and live.

That motivation for giving is found in 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, which ends with the word, "for God loves a cheerful giver."

I hope that in your response to the grace and mercy of God in your life, you will allow the joy of Jesus to fill your heart. And then, out of that heart of joy you will respond to the opportunities God gives you to give until it feels good.

TOLEDO SYMPHONY UPDATE: It is with great disappointment that the Toledo Symphony Community Christmas Concert scheduled for December 2 of this year, has been cancelled. The Symphony and the church are following the guidelines set forth for Covid-19. Therefore, social distancing, even among orchestra members, would severely affect our seating capacity for the Symphony to perform. The Toledo Symphony has put us on their schedule for 2022 and we can only look forward to this special event next year.

ALL SAINTS DAY: All Saints Day is a time to remember those beloved saints who have gone before us in faith, into the Church Triumphant. Grace Lutheran Church will observe *All Saints Day* at all weekend services on Saturday, November 6 and Sunday, November 7. During worship, names of members and friends of Grace Lutheran who have died during the preceding twelve months, will be read aloud, while a candle is lit and a bell rung. May we all be reminded of God's love and salvation that we have received through the cross of Jesus.

A Note From Pastor Mark

November means many things -- cool days and cold nights, and leaves that need to be raked. If the World Series has not yet been decided, it will be soon, and avid fans of the participating teams will either be joyfully celebrating or dolefully despairing. Ohio State and Michigan football fans are looking ahead to the big end-of-the-month showdown and whether either team will make the college football playoffs. If plans for where we're going to be on Thanksgiving Day have not yet been settled, it's time to make those decisions. For us at Grace, the focus will be on our Stewardship Program under the theme "Live Generously."

Thanksgiving is always a good time to reflect on and remember the many ways that God has blessed us. For most of us, the dual blessings of faith and family are at the top of any lists that we are asked to make of things that we are thankful for.

I continue to be thankful for the opportunity that I have to serve as your Intentional Interim Pastor since June 1 of this year. The longer I serve here, the more aware I become of the many spiritual strengths this congregation has. I know that Grace is a very special place for so many of the members of the congregation. This became very evident during the Small Group meetings which were held last month, at which we asked, "What does Grace mean to you personally?" One response was this:

It has become a second "home" for my family and me. Young families and friends brought us here. Our personal growth within the church and friends have kept us here.

Grace certainly has much to offer those who walk through its doors. Grace will also have much to offer the person who will be your next called pastor. This is a task that is taken seriously by everyone involved, including...

- Pastoral candidates, who complete a multi-page document called a Rostered Leader Profile, in which a candidate describes his or her call to faith and the gifts for ministry that he or she will bring to a new call to ministry.
- Bishops who approve of each candidate who is seeking a call in our synod
- Congregations in the call process that
 - appoint a Transition Team which seeks input from the congregation and completes a multi-page document called the Ministry Site Profile, which describes a congregation and its ministry for potential candidates, and
 - appoint a Call Committee to review candidate profiles, interview candidates and recommend one to the Congregation for call
- Call Process Facilitators, one from each conference in our synod, who meet regularly with synod staff to review Rostered Leader Profiles and Ministry Site Profiles, and try to match pastoral gits of candidates with the needs of congregations, and suggest candidates to congregations that are in the call process.

The Grace Transition Team will be completing and submitting the Ministry Site Profile in the coming weeks. You will notice that elsewhere in this newsletter is a form which invites your suggestions for those who you feel would be good choices for the Call Committee.

This process does take time. But that's good. Everyone involved wants to be sure that the next pastor at Grace will be the right person and a good "fit." I continue to be inspired by your faith and tenacity to move forward in faith toward the call of your new pastor.






