A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

I hope your celebration of Advent and Christmas was a joyous one in which you received some "presents," but also experienced in a profound way the "presence" of the one who became flesh in the Baby of Bethlehem, lived among us, and continues to come to us in Word and Sacrament.

The beginning of a new year is a good time to reflect on the year that has passed. 2021 may have been a year filled with joy and new experiences, or one that was filled with difficulty, sadness, and even tragedy, either for ourselves or for those close to us. When these happen, how do we respond? What do we say to ourselves and others?

My fear is that, too often, we revert to speaking or writing what are sometimes referred to as clichés which are meant to be helpful, but upon closer inspection, that may not be the case. Here are some examples, along with some explanations of why these may not be the best thing to say to a friend or write in a comment on social media.

When God Closes a Door, He Opens a Window

The simple truth is that sometimes God closes a door and nothing else opens. Sometimes, we're supposed to stay where we are and thus no "window" of another opportunity will appear. This saying can even cause pain to someone who truly has no other opportunity to pursue since it implies that the chance is there, they just can't find it. Instead of reciting this saying, offer to help the person find any opportunity that God may have provided. Don't provide a baseless promise that such an opportunity always exists.

Love the Sinner, Hate the Sin

I've heard it said that this cliché reflects 25% love, and 75% hate. The main problem with this cliché is that it focuses on the sin of the OTHER and sets us up as being "holier than thou." Bottom line, just don't say this. A truer and more honest formulation of this cliché would read "Love the sinner, hate MY sin.


Everything Happens for a Reason

Variants may include "God works in mysterious ways." This cliché can only cause further suffering to anyone in the midst of difficult circumstances since it makes God the cause of their trouble. Both sayings likely come from a misunderstanding of Romans 8:28: "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." This verse doesn't say that God specifically ordains every single thing, no matter how horrible it may be. It simply promises that God can bring about something good in spite of all the terrible things that happen.

God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle

The verse this saying is derived from refers to temptations, not to general trials in life. And even a quick reading of Psalms or the epistles shows that very godly people regularly experienced far, far more than they could handle and cried out to God for help. It would be closer to the truth to say that we're not promised troubles we could handle, we are promised help through the troubles.

I hope that a focus on some of these sometimes-overused clichés can help us Improve the way that we care for others in 2022. The best way to minister to our neighbors in distress is by meeting them where they are and showing the love of Christ. The more prepared we are to offer genuine help to those who need it, the more we can be the hands and feet of Jesus.



FROM THE LIFT PASTOR

As we begin a new year, we move from Advent into Christmas into Epiphany. Our waiting and anticipation becomes celebration and hope. Epiphany is a season of revelation. We hear stories about how God's promise is revealed in our world through the person of Jesus. On Epiphany, traditionally celebrated on January 6, we remember how the Magi found Jesus. I'm looking forward to our drive-in service on that day at St. John's at 7 p.m. These foreign astrologers saw a sign in the heavens and followed it to find it's meaning. The Bible is not totally clear on their complete identity. They are only mentioned in Matthew's gospel, it does not say home many of them there were, or that they were kings. They did, however, bring three gifts to the Christ Child. As we think of these visitors, we remember that the message of Jesus crosses all sorts of boundaries.


As a pastor, I like to encourage faith practices in the home. Family life complements life in the congregation. One spiritual practice to consider in the new year is a blessing of your dwelling place. Epiphany is a traditional time to have a prayer of blessing for a house. When the Magi visited Jesus and his family, they were filled with joy. "On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage." (Matthew 2:11)

According to an ancient practice, you can use chalk to put a visible blessing on the door frame of you house. With the numbers of the new year written above the door, the letters mean Criste Masionem Benedica, which means in Latin, "Christ, bless this house." There is also a tradition that the letters could be the names of the Magi, but this is a later tradition not described in the Bible, as mentioned above. This year the inscription looks like this: 20+C+M+B+22.

Let us pray: O God, you revealed your Son with the light of the star. The Magi followed the star to find your divine promise in the human form of Jesus. Reveal your healing and life-giving promise in this house during the ahead. Christ, bless this house. Amen.

As we go into the new year, I hope that we can keep discovering how God's promises are being revealed in our LIFT congregations. I look forward to a congregational life as we live out the discipleship together here in Fremont.


