A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

The month of May has long been one of my favorite months. Warm but not hot days (usually) and cool nights. The lawns become lush green, and farm fields move from winter dormancy to spring planting and the sprouting of what was planted. May is also the month that we remember and honor those who have served in our armed forces on Memorial Day weekend and remember our moms on Mother's Day.

So, allow me to use this "Mother's Day month" pastor's message to tell you a bit about my mom. Her given name was Alma Sophie Lenander, but ever since she was a child, she was known as "Dollie." She was born on a farm in northwest lowa in 1911, several years after her parents and oldest sister emigrated from Malmo, Sweden. The family moved several times, as my grandfather was a farmer, but not a landowner, and eventually found a home and farm in Deuel County, South Dakota.

Mom worked as a housekeeper during her young adult years, but eventually was certified and found work as a licensed nurse at the hospital in Hendricks, Minnesota, just over the state line from the farm where her parents had settled. There she met and in 1950 married my dad, who, with his dad, operated a Dodge Cars and Trucks and Case farm machinery business in Hendricks.


I'm sure you can do the math, but mom was 39 years old when she married my dad, who was 41 at the time (more about him next month!). My older brother Phil was born in 1951, and I showed up two years later. She was no doubt at home with my brother and me for a few years, but eventually continued her work as a nurse, and during my growing up years was the supervisor of the nursing home in Hendricks.

My dad died in 1982, so mom lived alone for the next 20 years, during which time the government and Medicare were very good to her. She lived in a subsidized apartment, had a hip replacement, heart bypass surgery, and a pacemaker implanted. When she died at age 90, she was receiving three-times-a-day assistance from home health, at no cost to her.

Mom's eyesight failed near the end of her life, which required some surgeries and transitional care. In February of 2002, I traveled to Hendricks from Ohio to visit mom, take her to her eye doctor, and get her settled back in her apartment. On the evening that I left to drive back to St. Paul where I stayed to catch an early morning flight for my return to Ohio, we had supper together, and shared devotions, during which we prayed for each other. After I had said my goodbyes and got on the road to the Twin Cities, my brother called mom, and they had a good 45-minute visit. On my way back to Ohio the next day, as I waited at Chicago Midway for my connecting flight, I received a phone call informing me that mom had died peacefully during the night, discovered by her home health nurse the next morning.

As I write this, I am reminded of what a great mom she was, and how much I miss her. She was loved by everyone who knew her. She had a great sense of humor, and always made me and so many others laugh.

The Easter season is an appropriate time to remember the new life that was given to us by our moms, and to give thanks for those who provided us with motherly care, which ultimately is a human metaphor for the love that our God has revealed to us in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I hope that you receive hope and inspiration as you reflect on our Lord's resurrection, and your own mother's love and care.



From the LIFT Pastor:

As we move through the Easter season, our lectionary readings on Sundays have been giving us a journey through the book of Acts. This fifth book of the New Testament, however, did not have a title in any of the original manuscripts. It's written by the same author as the Gospel of Luke and tells the story of the formation of the early decades of Christianity. Centuries after it was written down, editors called it Acts of the Apostles. Perhaps a better title would be "Acts of the Apostles and the Holy Spirit." It's the story of building the early Church, but the apostles do not do it on

their own. They are led by the Holy Spirit. In fact, the Holy Spirit is what makes church church. We are not a coffee-drinking, music performance club. We are not a service organization or a charity. Rather, we are the living body of Christ, filled and led and guided along the way by God the Holy Spirit, who gives us the gifts to be who we are.

Often people ask me what LIFT is. It can be confusing sometimes. Living in Faith Together, we are a partnership of congregations collaborating in the Fremont area. Together we are the body of Christ. We are individual congregations working together. This is an experimental model that can be an example for other communities as the religious landscape continues to change in this country. LIFT is a way for congregations to help each other, and for ministry to happen in ways that just couldn't if we were by ourselves. As LIFT pastor, I love being able to be connected with a variety of congregations. St. John's and Grace are historic downtown congregations. St. Mark is a neighborhood congregation deeply rooted in Fremont's east side. Emmanuel is a faithful rural congregation. Trinity has been an example of a church without walls.

Together, LIFT maintains the Bridge of Hope food pantry. Together, over a dozen young people have been learning about the Christian faith through our collaborative Confirmation program. Together, LIFT has been able to respond to the Spanish-speaking population of Fremont with the Camino de Vida ministry (this past month beginning regular Sunday morning worship after a few years of making connections within the community). Together, we're planning Vacation Bible School for July 11-14. Together, the Mercy Fund has helped people in crisis. Together, our pastoral leaders gather for collegiality and cooperation.

Some of LIFT's ministries have been impacted by the past two years of pandemic. It's harder to worship together in a large group. It's been difficult to be as present out in the community. In the next months, I'm hoping to reinvigorate opportunities for service, like the laundry ministry and some service projects. It's an opportune time for us to focus on our vision and identity My

hope is that LIFT can encourage new ways of being Church together. I wonder how the Holy Spirit is moving you. I wonder what new things we all can do together.
