

A LIFE CHANGING NIGHT

When Annette Smith Fisher's mom and dad transferred their membership to Grace when Annette was in the fourth grade, she had no idea what to expect from the big church on the hill. But as she and her husband Mark, along with their children, Kaitlyn (17) and Brenden (12), grow in their faith at Grace, she is grateful her parents brought her here so many years ago.

Annette was a busy mom, raising her two children, and taking care of a home, while teaching fourth grade, and coming to worship every Sunday. The world would say she had it all, but something was missing. Even with the busy life she was leading she was missing the support and fellowship of other young moms. She knew she needed more spiritual food.

The answer came when Grace offered a Wednesday night program called Spirit. There was a meal followed by a group called, S.L.A.M. (Scripture, Life, and Me), along with groups for the children. This made it possible to have adult time while the children were with their peers. When Annette started coming to S.L.A.M. she had no idea how it would change her life. The group is always there to study together, laugh together, grieve with one another, celebrate the birth of children together, and challenge one another. It was just the support system Annette was looking for and she has been a part of the group for twenty years. Even during Covid the group kept meeting. They just moved into a field that belonged to a member or met on zoom.



No longer was Annette feeling the void of college and high school friends moving away or taking a different life path. No longer was she feeling she was the only one struggling to juggle raising children, being a wife and working mother while feeling emotionally and spiritually empty. She had found the support she needed and a way to give back as she also offered support to the members. When one of the members of the group became sick with stage four pancreatic cancer, the group rallied around her and her husband and children to offer support. When the member passed away Annette and three other group members began visiting the mother of their friend. Another wonderful relationship was formed as companionship and love was shown to a mother who had lost her only daughter.

The Wednesday night program, including S.L.A.M. was the gift Annette was needing in her life as a young mom and has grown into a ministry for all the members as each one supports the other. But it doesn't stop there. The members step outside the walls of the church to also offer their time and abilities to help in other ways by visiting a grieving mother, participating in community workdays, and participating in cancer walks. Annette is grateful for the programing at Grace that makes all these opportunities for education, mission work and support possible. They are life giving and life changing!

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Last month, I attended the Northwestern Ohio Synod Assembly at the Bowen-Thompson Student Union of Bowling Green State University. Joining me in representing Grace at this event were Richard and Nelda Bauer, Henry and Becky Seibert, and Ed Muffler.

There were about 300 persons in attendance from the 161 congregations of our synod. This was the first in-person gathering of the synod in a long time, I believe since 2018, so it was good to be back together to worship, learn and make decisions for the future of our synod.

The word "synod" comes from two Greek words *syn*, meaning "together," and "*hodos*," meaning "road." So, a "synod" is a group of people, in this case, gathered together in congregations, who are "walking together" in faith and in mission.

There are several things that we do together at a synod assembly. We do the business of the synod in what are called plenary sessions, such as conduct elections, approve spending plans, and debate and pass resolutions. Bishop Daniel Beaudoin won re-election to a second six-year term as bishop on the first ballot with 83% of the vote. We are blessed to have such a competent, effective, and spirit-filled leader in Bishop Daniel.

Another important part of an assembly is worship, learning and fellowship. Our learning/fellowship sessions, which were called "Story Walks," were based on the Luke 24 story of the disciples who joined Jesus on a walk to Emmaus after his resurrection. As we join the journey of these disciples, we learn how to tell our own stories to help us better understand that Jesus walks with us on the way.

Our storytellers included Ingrid, who spoke of what it is like to be a young person, 24 years old, in a church whose membership has such a high percentage of senior citizens. Pastor Doris spoke of what it is like to be a person of color in a denomination that is 97% Caucasian. Our own Pastor Mary Carmen from Camino Da Vida spoke of the experience of being a Hispanic person seeking to get a visa and a green card.

At the end of this story in Luke 24, the disciples break bread with Jesus, and only then do they realize who had been walking with them. "Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

I try to do "road time" every evening, walking a total of about 2.8 miles on the same route up Main Street in Huron to the railroad tracks, and then back home again. Several months ago, I began having brief conversations with the owner of one of the homes that I regularly walked past. I'll call him "Joe." He was sometimes outside with his dog, so I'd stop and chat a bit. Among other things he shared with me some of the health issues he was having and having his 92-year-old father live with him in his house.

On our most recent visit a few days ago, he asked me what kind of work I did, and I told him I'm a pastor. He was a bit surprised, but it became an opportunity to share some elements of my faith with him.

Will there be opportunities to go deeper with Joe? Maybe, maybe not. But we really never know when and how we might meet up with Jesus on the road, and how stopping to talk might change our lives, our communities, and the world.

ROOTS OF OUR FAITH - Pastor Mark will be leading a five-session course this summer called "Roots of Our Faith." This course is for anyone who wants to learn more about the basics of our faith as Lutheran Christians, and is recommended for anyone who would like to become a member of Grace, or who wants to review the basics. The class will begin on June 26, and conclude on July 24, and will meet from 9 - 9:45 am. Below is a summary of the course and the content that will be addressed at each session.

- How can we interpret and make sense of Scripture?

July 17 - How we as Lutherans apply God's story to our lives (Part1)

- Difference between "up" and "down" religion
- What is sin?
- Law and Gospel. What does that mean?
- What did the death of Jesus accomplish?
- What is the church?

July 24 - How we as Lutherans apply God's story to our lives (Part2)

- What are the sacraments?
- How do we pray and worship?
- How does God want us to live?
- Two kingdoms: what does that mean?
- Christ will come again. Should we be worried?








New Service Opportunity!
