It's Back-to-School Time!

LIFT will participate in the Backpack Buddies program beginning in early September and has been partnered with Lutz Elementary school. This is an exciting chance to partner in the community and meet some real hunger needs—filling gaps for kids to eat on the weekends when there is no school lunch program. It involves sending a backpack home on weekends with some healthy snacks and food that kids can prepare on their own. School staff identifies students with food insecurity issues at home. We will provide backpacks and food, assemble them and deliver them to the school. School staff will distribute them to students. This year LIFT is moving away from our usual school supply collection in order to focus on this project. To help fund this project, we are seeking financial contributions and donations of kid-friendly food items in individual servings. Look for black baskets at LIFT congregations. Make checks out to LIFT, with **Backpacks** noted on the memo line. To help streamline donations and insure appropriate items, we are encouraging different congregations to focus on specific products.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Pastors do many things, but one very important thing we do is prepare couples for marriage. Together, Maureen and I will be officiating a total of three weddings at Grace during August and September.

A very helpful tool for preparing couples for marriage that I have used for almost all the years I have been a pastor is a survey called “Prepare.” This 165 question survey, when completed and processed, identifies areas of a couple’s relationship which are strong, and which need further growth. Some of the areas that are evaluated include communication, conflict resolution, and financial issues.

Another area that is measured by the Prepare survey is called Marriage Expectations. This category measures how realistic or unrealistic each individual is about love, marriage, and the typical challenges that all married couples face. Couples can be either realistic or unrealistic about those challenges. One of the questions on the survey in this category reads like this: “Love is all we will need for a happy marriage.” If couples agree or strongly agree to this item, the survey will give them a lower score in this category than if they had disagreed or strongly disagreed.

Sometimes the calling of a new pastor has been compared to a marriage. There is a courtship time (Ministry Site Profiles and Rostered Leader Profiles), dating (interviews, both remotely via Zoom and in person), a decision time (congregational vote to call and acceptance of the call) and a worship service to make promises to each other and to celebrate the new relationship (Installation Service). And like a marriage, in the calling of a pastor there can be realistic and unrealistic expectations on the part of the pastor being called and the calling congregations.

What might be some unrealistic expectations on the part of the congregation? One might be that the new pastor will be a particular gender, age, or marital and family status. Another might be the expectation that the new pastor will restore some aspect of congregational life that was present in previous years or decades. In each case, we trust that the call committee will choose the candidate who is most suitable and has the gifts for ministry that will lead the congregation forward in proclamation and service.

What are some realistic expectations that the congregations can have of their new pastor? I offer the following, which are drawn from the Service for the Installation of a Pastor: “That he/she will preach and teach in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and the Confessions of the Lutheran Church; that he/she will love, serve and pray for you, and nourish you with the Word and Sacraments, and lead you by example in the use of the means of grace, faithful service and holy living.”

The Call Committee at Grace is continuing to do the work you have entrusted them to do: reviewing Rostered Leader Profiles of candidates submitted by the Synod Office, interviewing candidates that are deemed to be a good fit for the leadership needs at Grace, and eventually recommending to the Congregation Council and ultimately the congregation a candidate to call as your next pastor. Please continue to keep this most important process, and all those involved in it, in your prayers.

PERSONAL CARE KITS: one light-weight bath towel (20x40 to 52x27) dark color recommended, bath size bars of soap 8-9 oz in original wrapper, adult size toothbrush in original package, sturdy comb (NO picks or fine tooth), metal nail clippers.

BABY CARE KITS: lightweight cotton t-shirts (NO onesies), long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (NO feet), receiving blankets, jackets, sweaters or sweatshirts with hoods or include a baby cap (sizes 6 - 24 months), socks, hand towels - dark color recommended, bath sized bars of gentle soap 8-9 oz in original package, diaper pins or large safety pins.

SCHOOL KITS: 70 sheet spiral notebooks - wide or college ruled (NO loose leaf paper), 30 centimeter rulers (these can be one side centimeters; other side inches), pencil sharpener, blunt scissors, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, black or blue ballpoint pens (NO gel pens), crayons - boxes of 16 or 24, 2 1/2" erasers.

NOISY OFFERING is received the first weekend of each month. Collections received are then donated to a mission chosen by the Christian Missions and Outreach Committee.

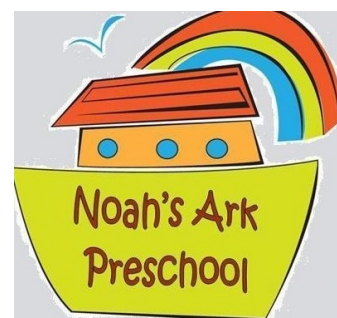

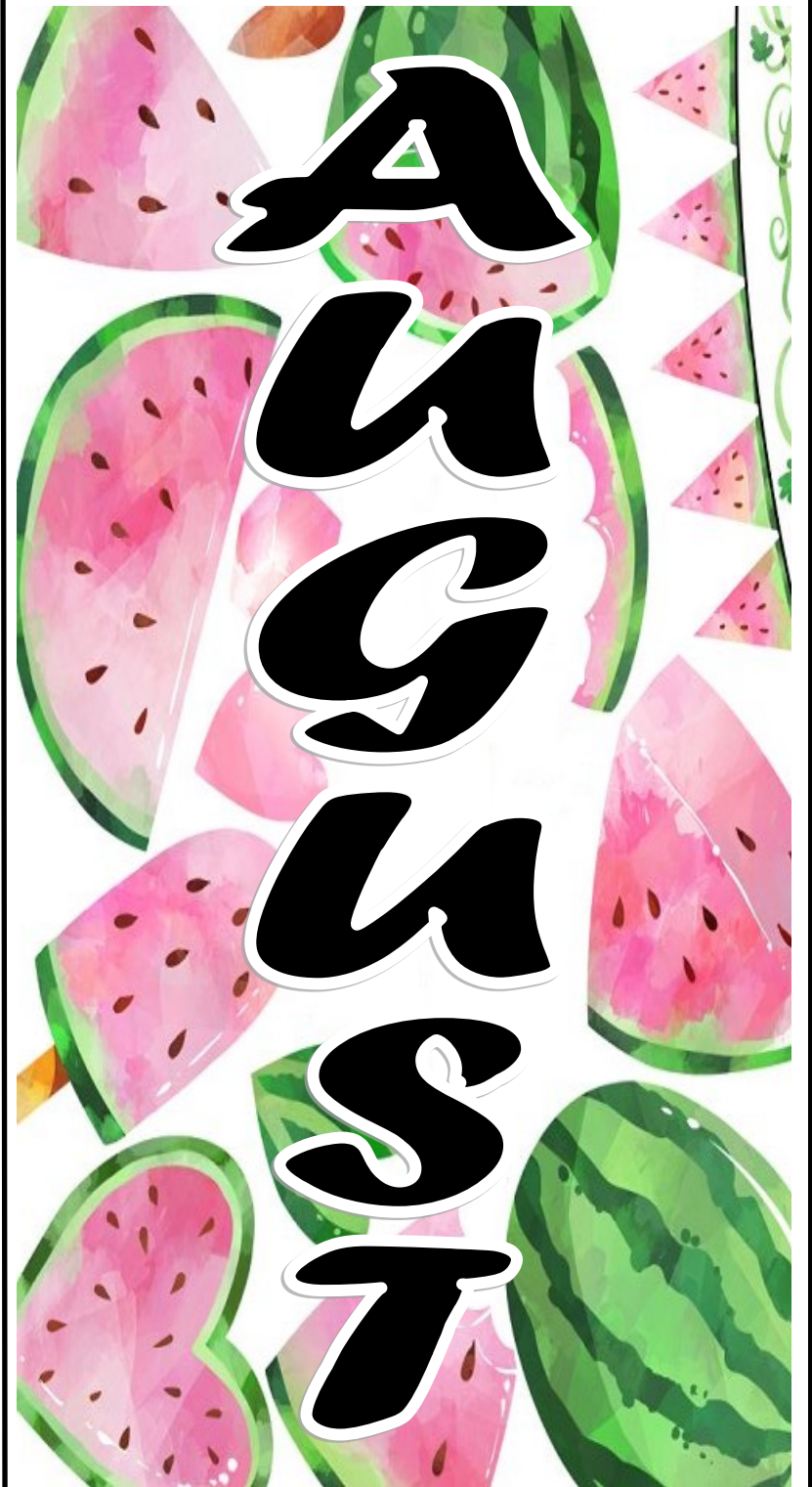
