Call Committee Update

Greetings from the Call Committee!

This past weekend, the second reading during worship resonated with me concerning the search for our next senior pastor, especially the first verse: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (*Hebrews 11:1*). It is so very difficult to wait and wonder and worry... and wait some more... and worry some more... and seemingly wait even longer. But we must remain confident in the Holy Spirit. We must keep the faith. Even though we do not know who this individual is, or when they will arrive, or exactly how their faith journey will overlap with ours, God knows.

Rest assured that your Call Committee is meeting regularly, communicating frequently, and working tirelessly on your behalf. We follow the same protocol with each candidate. Following a review of a candidate's Rostered Minister Profile (RMP), we meet to decide whether or not the candidate's gifts match our church family's needs. We begin with a virtual interview and a list of 10 questions. If the committee discerns (after discussion and prayer) that the candidate has potential to fulfill our call, we move on to hosting an in-person interview. To date, we have thoroughly and prayerfully reviewed each of the RMPs that Mary Satterfield (Synod Call Facilitator) has shared with us. And we will continue to pursue all potential avenues until the Holy Spirit matches us with the next successful senior pastor for Grace.

Contact any one of us with your questions. As a refresher, your Call Committee members are Nelda Bauer, Kathy Burmeister, Levi Cooper, Ike Durell, Kaitlyn Fisher, Roger Haynes, Greg Jess, AJ Mehlow, Ed Muffler and myself. Also, as you may recall, we must ensure candidate confidentiality. But we can always share generally about the process and our progress. And we still need your prayers. Pray for discernment for all pastoral candidates, for all churches actively calling a pastor, and for the dedicated committee members all working toward a positive outcome. Pray for unity, spiritual strength, wisdom, and endurance as we continue on this faith journey together.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Here's a story from my 2017 interim at First Lutheran in Galion. I had followed Pastor Matt, who, after ten years at First, accepted the call to St. John's in Fremont.

It was early afternoon on Thursday, June 15th, and I was planning on leaving the church soon to make a few visits before the evening Council meeting. As I left the office and started toward the door, a man who I did not know was walking down the hall toward my office. I knew right away he was looking for some kind of help, and for a moment my heart sank. I've been in this situation before, and too often, I fear, I've been conned. He began to tell his story.

His name was Brandon, and he wanted to know if there was any way I could help him get back to his home near Maclure, Illinois. He then proceeded to tell his story. He was unable to find work in Illinois, so he started to cast a wider net. Somehow, he had made a connection with someone from a construction company in Galion who promised him not only work, but a place to live.

On the basis of those assurances, Brandon took the train from Illinois to Sandusky. He was under the impression that his future employer would pick him up at the train station, but that did not happen. Brandon said that he was told the apartment he had been promised was not ready yet, so he found his way to Crossroads, the homeless shelter in Sandusky.

He stayed at the shelter for several weeks, and finally decided that if he were to get the work he was promised, he would have to get to Galion by himself. He said that he got an old bike from a local church and, leaving his baggage behind at the homeless shelter, started riding south toward Norwalk. He told me that the bike gave out just south of Norwalk, so he ditched it and started walking, and walked all the way to Mansfield, where Harmony House Homeless Services provided him food and shelter for a few days.

On Monday, Brandon said, he left Harmony House and started walking to Galion. He must have spent three nights on the street, and on Thursday he found an open door at First Lutheran.

As mentioned above, I listened to his story, and then did a bit of research, checking on bus and train fares, and thinking about how I would deal with Brandon. I did my due diligence and called the Galion Police, and using info on Brandon's Illinois state ID, determined that there were no warrants for his arrest, although there was a protection order and a DUI on his record. After more conversation with Brandon and more checking of prices, I determined that the best option would be to get him an Amtrak ticket from Sandusky.

He said that he hadn't eaten anything since Monday, so I called Tammy Smith and asked her if there were any leftovers from Tuesday's community supper, and she said yes, but she would have to cook it. I said, no, that's OK, I'll take him to Wendy's. So, Brandon and I went to Wendy's, where he picked out a value meal which we brought back to the church. By this time, Tammy had arrived and had brought with her some food items that Brandon could take with him.

As I was sitting in the narthex with Brandon and Tammy, I heard the church office phone ring. I answered the call, and the voice on the other end of the line identified herself as Brandon's mother. She had heard nothing from Brandon for days, was very worried about him, must have known that he could be in Galion, because she called the Galion Police department to see if they had had any contact with Brandon. As a matter of fact, the police dispatcher said, you are the second person to call asking about Brandon today. The dispatcher told her that the pastor at the Lutheran Church had called asking about Brandon because he wanted to help him get home.

I told Brandon's mother, whose name is Laura, that Brandon was in the next room, and called him to the phone.

It wasn't long after Brandon hung up the phone that he and I got into my car and headed for Sandusky. A west-bound train would arrive and depart at about 5:30 am on Friday morning, and

he'd catch another train south to get the rest of the way home.

Since Brandon had left all his personal items, which included two large suitcases, at the Crossroads shelter, we stopped there first to see if his bags were still there. Lucky for him, they were, and we loaded them up and headed for the Amtrak station.

At the station, I made the reservation and payment for Brandon's return trip over the phone, and his ID and the ticket info emailed to my phone was all he needed. I got back in my car and made it back to Galion in time for Council meeting.

A story said to originate in a Russian Orthodox monastery has an older monk telling a younger one: "I have finally learned to accept people as they are. Whatever they are in the world, a prostitute, a prime minister, it is all the same to me. But sometimes I see a stranger coming up the road, and I say, "Oh, Jesus Christ, is it you again?"

Certainly, Brandon is no longer a stranger, and most of those who come to partake of meals at First aren't, although some are. But their appearances on First Lutheran's doorstep and within our walls are a reminder to all of us that whenever we meet someone in need, especially a stranger, it is good to ask the question posed from the older monk to the younger: "Oh Jesus Christ, is that you again?"

Hey ladies, do you feel like your days are



PERSONAL CARE KITS: one light-weight bath towel (20x40 to 52x27) dark color recommended, bath size bars of soap 8-9 oz in original wrapper, adult size toothbrush in original package, sturdy comb (NO picks or fine tooth), metal nail clippers.

BABY CARE KITS: lightweight cotton t-shirts (NO onesies), long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (NO feet), receiving blankets, jackets, sweaters or sweatshirts with hoods or include a baby cap (sizes 6 - 24 months), socks, hand towels - dark color recommended, bath sized bars of gentle soap 8-9 oz in original package, diaper pins or large safety pins.

SCHOOL KITS: 70 sheet spiral notebooks - wide or college ruled (NO loose leaf paper), 30 centimeter rulers (these can be one side centimeters; other side inches), pencil sharpener, blunt scissors, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, black or blue ballpoint pens (NO gel pens), crayons - boxes of 16 or 24, 2 1/2" erasers.


LIVING IN FAITH TOGETHER


