Return to Grace

If you regularly attend Grace, it is likely you have seen and heard Peggy Rutherford. She is a member of the choir, and occasionally serves as a Reader and Assisting Minister.

As a child she belonged, with her family, to the Methodist Church. A member of Grace, who was her mother's friend, invited them to Grace and they became members. Peggy reports that there was no really big change when she joined as a child, but when leaving and returning as an adult after a number of traumatic life experiences, Grace had a significant impact upon her life.

When asked what she was most thankful for at Grace, Peggy said "My large Christian family." When apart from the church she was missing a feeling of closeness to God that she felt when involved in the church.

Although Peggy has been involved with the church most of her life, except for the hiatus described above, she believes that as a child her family was looking for a place to worship; as an adult she was seeking a place to feel closer to God.

When she returned to Grace as an adult, a number of people in the congregation stand out as having an impact upon her decision to make Grace her church home again. First she recalls the empathy shown by Pastor Beth and the grace shown to her by Pastor Paul Fuchs. Other significant people upon her return included members Mary Sachs and Mike Billings who encouraged her to share her musical talents by joining the choir. In addition to belonging to the choir, Peggy directed a children's choir which was a special inspiration to the congregation for many years.

When asked what made her stay, Peggy shared that she felt wanted and needed at Grace and missed being part of the congregation. She believes that her return was spirit-led. She was also motivated, in part, by the fact that she was soon to become a grandmother and wanted to provide a strong spiritual base for her grandchildren; a gift she had been given as a child. Maureen's Bible studies were another factor which encouraged her to stay.

Peggy knows that wherever she is in life she can feel the presence of Christ at Grace, which has taught her to forgive, and provides a sense of peace and protection that brings joy to her life.

The welcoming spirit of Grace and the generosity of its members make it possible for weekly word and sacrament worship and opportunities for community, learning and fellowship. Thank you to all those who help keep the ministry at Grace strong so it can continue to impact and change lives.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

In all the congregations I have served, whether as the called pastor or the interim pastor, there has always been what I would call spiritual giants, members for whom it was clear they had a close walk and relationship with God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

One of those giants in the first parish that I served was "Margaret". Margaret knew how to both talk about her faith and was diligent in living out that faith in her daily life.

I remember how, in 1984, when I received a phone call from Lutheran Social Service in Fargo with a request to consider sponsoring two Polish refugees, who were hours away from being returned to Poland unless they found a sponsor, I said "Yes". And so, I went to the airport in Bismarck, North Dakota, where Tomasz Włodarczyk and Lucjan Chrzan got off the plane and I met them for the first time, unable to speak a word of English.

I was still single at the time, but the parsonage in which I was living had a finished basement with two bedrooms and a bathroom. So, I had space to share. When I informed the congregations of what I had done and asked for help, Margaret was one of several members of my two congregations who stepped up and provided beginning English lessons for Tomasz and Lucjan. Margaret's family also welcomed and even employed them for some small jobs around their farmstead. I can still hear Tomasz say Margaret's name with his Polish accent as he spoke affectionately of people at St. Paul's and Our Saviors that helped him make the transition to a new land and country.

Margaret had gifts for writing, and wrote a weekly column for the local newspaper, which I looked forward to reading. Margaret's faith and determination were also inspiring as she dealt with medical issues which affected her daily routine. None of those issues seemed to slow her up from her work on the farm. I remember one time when visiting her and her family, she took me downstairs and I saw many full shelves of home canned goodness, picked from the garden, and put away for family meals in the dead of winter. So many fond and inspiring memories of such a spiritual giant.

A postscript on Tomasz and Lucjan. I completely lost track of Lucjan. But as names and phone numbers became more and more available on the internet, I was able to reconnect with Tomasz. He had found work in San Antonio, and eventually brought his wife and young son who he had initially left behind in Poland.

In 2006, the ELCA Youth Gathering was held in San Antonio, which I attended with my youth group from St. Peter in Norwalk. Tomasz and his wife Kristina joined our group for dinner at a restaurant on the Riverwalk for an enjoyable reunion, 22 years after his arrival at the Bismarck airport.

Margaret and Tomasz. Both are for me spiritual giants. Margaret, for her faith active in love, and Tomasz for his amazing journey, putting his life into God's hands to find a new life of freedom. Who are some of your spiritual giants?
