

SURVIVING HURRICANE IAN

Ardis and Dennis Curliss are Snowbirds in Fort Myers, Florida. Ardis recently shared in a letter to Grace, their "God Moments" during their encounter with Hurricane Ian.

This is not the first time we have experienced a hurricane here. Ian hit us hard. This was VERY different but God was with us all the way. I kept a list of our God Moments and here are a few.

- Our son, Steve, drove us down and was still here. Strong arms were needed because of Dennis's shoulder surgery.
- During what we thought was the hurricane, because it was like others we had experienced, a woman knocked on our door. She
 was in her daughter's unit and went to the lanai and the door closed and she was locked out. She was trying to walk to her sons
 a few buildings away and saw Dennis in the window. She didn't think anyone else was in the building.
- Just after she arrived, Steve yelled "OH NO!" He saw a wall of water coming our way and it was a building away. He ran down and tried to move our cars to a small hill. It was to the car door by the time he got down the steps.
- When he got back in, the HUGE lan hit. Our bedroom window flew out. Steve, our lady stranger, Dennis, & myself held the window to the hole for 4 hours because the wind was too strong to get it back in the track. Water was coming in all around it because the wind was full of water. The fourth person ran for towels and things to stuff in the one broken pane. Towels kept getting saturated and needed replaced. When the winds died down to normal hurricane strength, they were able to get the window partially in the track enough to hold it. Our stranger's name was Rictoria. Isn't that a great name for an angel!! Water had risen to tops of cars and cars were floating. Ours were still on the hill.
- Water was down the next day to wading level.
- Our kids gave Dennis a solar charger for his birthday in August. This helped with cell phones. We had no power, no water, no internet.
- Our water returned Friday; some still have no water.
- I had told Steve which hill to park on but he chose another place. As it turns out, my hill was loaded with a blown over carport, posts, and all.
- We had candles and a light my daughter-in-law gave me for Christmas a make-up mirror with light. It was great light!
- Our Clubhouse had generators. Our Clubhouse is unusual down here because it serves meals 3 nights a week. They started serving 2 meals a day. Since we have no cars yet, when the ground drained enough, we went there for a few suppers. Not an easy walk, but it was good to get out.

We now have water, power, but no cars or internet, but we are SO blessed. When the water went down, I found dimes and pennies at the bottom of our steps in the carports. On Friday, a rainbow showed up on our living room wall.

I lived 18 years with friends, Michael and Connie Kosta in Fremont. I was blessed to travel back and forth to Cameroon, Africa, where I worked with Pastor Amba Bangbe Claude in SNAP Ministries mission. Grace Lutheran Church was vital to this ministry in praying and helping support it.

Just this year, my niece and her husband (Steve and Chris Young) asked me to stay with them in Port Clinton, Ohio. Chris and Steve grew up at Grace Lutheran Church also. Later Chris became a Lutheran pastor. I am so grateful for Grace Lutheran's love, acceptance, teaching and living of Christ's Word. "Grace" certainly lives up to its name.



A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

November means many things -- cool days and cold nights, and leaves that need to be raked. It also means following our favorite sports teams, whether it's the Cleveland Guardians in their postseason run, or college football fans looking ahead to the big end-of-the-month showdown between Ohio State and Michigan. If plans for where we're going to be on Thanksgiving Day have not yet been settled, it's time to make those decisions.



For us at Grace, the primary focus in November will be on our Stewardship Program under the theme "Live Simply." This program will call us to hear God's voice speak amid and above the

program will call us to hear God's voice speak amid and above the clutter, distractions, and complexity of life in the world in which we live. Our program will challenge us to:

- Follow Jesus What does it mean for us to live in relationship with Him?
- Face the Truth During the storms of life, do we focus on the wind and waves, or on what God provides?
- Act Together Are we able to begin to see that God provides us with more than enough?
- **Share Enough** If we focus on scarcity, we never have enough. When we focus on God's blessings, there is more than we can imagine. Are we able to see the blessings rather than the scarcity?

On Sunday, November 13, we will gather as a congregation at 9:15 am in the Dining Room for a time of simple morning refreshments, and a time to talk with one another about what Grace means to us. We will distribute a Live Simply packet which will include information about ministry at Grace, and will challenge us to follow Jesus, face the truth, act together and share enough. Those unable to attend the November 13 event will receive their packets via US Mail.

This packet will also include an "Intent Card" which will let congregation leaders know your financial commitment to the ministry at Grace for 2023, which we would like you to bring with you to worship on November 19-20.

I can't emphasize enough the importance of your response to this campaign. This year without the significant boost in income from federal pandemic relief programs that we received in 2020 and 2021, our expenses continue to exceed offerings.

I plan to increase my giving to Grace in 2023, and I encourage you to join me, and "take hold of the life that really is life." (1 Timothy 6:19) **We have a God of abundance,** not scarcity. God will continue to work through us at Grace using our hands, our feet, and yes, our giving.






LIFT a New Leaf

My favorite Christmas tradition is...






We have parent teacher conferences later this month. And, we will have a visit from the Fremont Fire Department when we learn about the letter "F". Great things are happening at the Ark!

CHURCH COUNCIL - Minutes October 10, 2022

- Call Committee Update the committee is scheduled to interview another two candidates. The Synod continues to search for more possibilities.
- Budget planning for 2023 has begun. Giving is down. If people not currently giving, would simply give \$.50 a week, it could generate over thirteen thousand dollars!
