#### I RAN THE BASES AND WOUND UP AT HOME

Cecilia has been married to Ron Boucher for 36 years and they are blessed with one son and three granddaughters. Cecilia was raised Catholic but joined Ron at Grace when they were married.

She appreciates the financial transparency found at Grace, liturgical worship, the friendliness of the members and the beauty of the sanctuary. "Sometimes you have to walk away from something to really appreciate it," says Cecilia.

Cecilia feels one of the gifts of Grace is the opportunity to share the gifts God has given her. Certainly, the opportunity to give from her resources, but also by working behind the scenes helping with many details. When Cecilia realizes how much God loves her how can she not give back to say thank you!



## A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Chances are that you will read this before Thanksgiving Day and its traditions of a festive meal with family or friends and watching Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade on television. That parade is traditionally bookended by a Tom Turkey float at the beginning who leads the parade down the parade route, and Santa riding in his sleigh at the end, marking the official transition to the holiday season, followed by regular reminders of how many shopping days remain until Christmas.

This time of year is also a time of transition for us in the church. The old church year comes to an end toward or at the end of November with Christ the King, this year on November 20, and a new church year begins with the First Sunday in Advent, this year on November 27.

The season of Advent is a season of preparation for the celebration of Christmas, of God becoming one of us in the Baby of Bethlehem, of the miracle of the Incarnation. This begins what is sometimes referred to as the Festival Half of the Church year. During the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter, we focus on Christ's life and what He has done for us.

This is an excellent time to make a "Church New Year's Resolution" to worship faithfully. What better way to prepare for the coming of our Lord than to celebrate and reaffirm what is central to our faith, clearly identified in the Confession of Faith from the Grace Constitution, which mirrors the constitution of the ELCA:

This Congregation confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and the Gospel as the power of God for the salvation of all who believe.

- Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate, through whom everything was made and through whose life, death, and resurrection God fashions a new creation.
- The proclamation of God's message to us as both Law and Gospel is the Word of God, revealing judgment and mercy through word and deed, beginning with the Word in creation, continuing in the history of Israel, and centering in all its fullness in the person and work of Jesus Christ.
- The canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written Word of God. Inspired by God's Spirit speaking through their authors, they record and announce God's revelation centering in Jesus Christ. Through them God's Spirit speaks to us to create and sustain Christian faith and fellowship for service in the world.

I like that last sentence very much: to create and sustain Christian faith and fellowship for service in the world. Dr. Timothy Wengert, professor emeritus of United Lutheran Seminary, puts it this way: "To turn our common life toward this center is our only task in the world today; to open that center to the weak ones of the world is our only mission."

As you await the call of your new pastor, I encourage you to keep your focus on that mission by asking and answering the following questions: "Who are we?," "What is God calling us to do?" and "Who are our neighbors?"




