A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Every year in late winter, pastors and lay people from across the country ascend the Rocky Mountains of Colorado for a week of continuing education, spiritual renewal, and winter play. This is an annual continuing education event that takes place every February at Winter Park, Colorado, and goes by the name "Recreation and Revelation."

The "Recreation" part of this event involves the activities that happen in and around Winter Park. For most who attend, including myself, that activity is downhill skiing on the 3,000 plus acres and over 150 trails that stretch from the 12,000 foot summit to the 9,000 foot base.

"Revelation" is the continuing education part. Each year the program features two esteemed theologians in morning and evening sessions. This year our presenters are Dr.'s Kelly Sherman-Conroy and Ryan Bonfiglio. Kelly is a Native American theologian from the Oglala Sioux Tribe, the people who inhabited the land where I grew up and my great-grandparents homesteaded. Ryan is a Professor of Old Testament at Candler School of Theology in Atlanta.

In their morning and evening presentation, Kelly and Ryan "will explore the purpose, place, and practice of Sabbath in faith formation and pastoral leadership... special emphasis will be placed on practical ways in which we can cultivate Sabbath keeping in our everyday lives and church leadership," according to information that was provided for those attending.

In addition to the morning and evening lectures, daily worship and fellowship over meals and end of the day refreshments also nourishes participants in body and spirit. Through my participation in this event, I have not only been able to reconnect with persons I attended seminary with, but also make many new friends.

Over my 40 plus years of pastoral ministry, I have attended many continuing education events, but since I started attending Recreation and Revelation in 2018, it has become my favorite way to fulfill at least a portion of the hours that I am expected to engage in continuing education activities. It is the expectation of the ELCA and the Northwestern Ohio Synod that every rostered minister will engage in at least 50 hours of continuing education per year. Our Northwestern Ohio Synod Compensation Guidelines offers the following perspective:

Continuing education is intended to benefit both the rostered minister and the congregation through ongoing development of biblical/theological understanding and ministry skills.

When you call your new pastor, be sure to include the following recommendations from the compensation guidelines with regard to time and financial support for continuing education: a reimbursement of at least \$1,200, and at least two weeks (a total of 14 days including two Sundays) accruable for up to three years.

Lent: A Time of Spiritual Growth

The season of Lent is a 40-day time of preparation for Easter. It began as a period of baptismal instruction for new Christians.
