# A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

The story of Lutherans in North America is one of immigration and mergers. Lutherans came to "the new world" in waves of immigration from different parts of Germany and Scandinavia, settling in many parts of North America. Each group brought their own pieties, structures, and worship practices. Over the past two hundred years, these smaller church bodies gradually merged into larger ones. Most recently – 1988 – the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) was formed from three predecessor churches, resulting in the largest Lutheran church in North America.

An interesting thing about this pattern of immigration and merger is that most of the formal mergers were preceded by cooperative work on common worship materials. Consider this timeline:

- 1958 The Service Book and Hymnal (the old "red book") was published.
- 1960 The American Lutheran Church (ALC) was formed as a merger of three smaller Lutheran denominations (Grace was a part of this merger).
- 1978 Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) was published (Grace's current "green book").
- 1988 The ELCA was formed as a merger of the ALC, LCA, and the AELC (a small group that broke away from the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod).

Since the formation of the ELCA in 1988, we've seen the following developments in worship resources:

- In 1995 With One Voice (a supplemental worship book and song collection with a soft blue cover) was published.
- *Worship Jubilee 2000* was a large Churchwide gathering that officially kicked off the *Renewing Worship* project. "Renewing Worship" was the umbrella title for many layers of work over the next 6 years, resulting in the publication of a new hymnal.
- Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) was published in 2006. This cranberry-colored hymnal and worship resource is currently in use by almost all ELCA.

ELW provides much more flexibility than previous worship books. For some this is refreshing and welcome. For others, it is simply baffling and confusing. Another feature of ELW is that many hymns composed after the printing of LBW in 1978 are included, many of which have become congregational favorites.

With the advent of the internet and licensing of worship materials to be downloaded and printed, many congregations have greatly reduced their dependence on a printed hymnal. At Grace, we have been printing the full worship texts and music in our weekly bulletins, as well as hymns. More recently, when a chosen hymn is in our LBW (green book), we have been singing out of the hymnal.

My concern is that our LBW's at Grace are not only outdated (published 45 years ago), but also looking worn out and shabby. They do not necessarily make a good impression on a first-time visitor. The Worship Committee has agreed that the time has come to move forward with new hymnals.

The cost for one Evangelical Lutheran Worship "Pew Edition" is \$24.50, and we will need about 300 to fill our pews. Grace members would be invited to purchase one or more hymnals, and the balance would be covered by existing funds at Grace. Hymnals given in memory of a loved one would be noted with bookplates on the inside front cover, as they have in the past.

This project is in its earliest stages, and Council has not yet taken specific action. We welcome your input as we seek to provide the resources that Grace needs to worship and experience God's presence with us in word and sacrament.






# **Playfully Present in the Community: Summer Park Tour**

Each day will include songs, devotion, bells/chimes, recorders and drumming and a snack.


A closing program will be held Thursday, June 29 at 6pm. Friends and family are invited to see what the kids have learned over the week.

#### A NOTE TO THE CONGREGATION:

Grace Lutheran Church has received a generous bequest from a deceased church member. While the family has asked to remain anonymous, we are grateful and appreciative for this gift. The paperwork and transfer of funds has taken several months and is now complete. The Executive Committee of Council approved these funds to be placed in a Cash Management Account through Croghan Colonial Bank's trust division. The funds are FDIC insured, earning interest well above savings and money market accounts, and are liquid and available as needed. In addition, all future undesignated bequests and memorials will be placed into this account to ensure we are being good stewards of the funds. Withdrawals and use of funds will require Executive Committee approval.




