



It's a Part of My Life

On almost any Sunday morning during worship at Grace, you will see John Avers near the back of the pulpit side of the sanctuary, and close to the center aisle. If you are sitting near him, you will also hear his excellent singing voice.

John's earliest years of life were on a farm in the Lindsey area where his dad was a sharecropper. John remembers how hard his dad worked, receiving 1/3 of the proceeds of his work, whether it was the crops that he raised or cords of wood that he chopped. When John was just starting school, his dad contracted polio. After a long period of rehabilitation, he lived the remainder of his life paralyzed from the waist down. John remembers being inspired by his parents, who moved to Fremont and started and operated an embroidery business, a job that John's dad could do productively from his wheelchair.

With their home now in Fremont, John's family joined Grace, which nurtured him in his faith, and gave him many opportunities to participate and serve. He affirmed his faith in the Rite of Confirmation in 1961, and participated enthusiastically in Junior and Senior Luther League. After graduating from Fremont Ross in 1965, and from Luther College in Decorah, lowa in 1969, and then serving in the Army for three years, John returned to Fremont and to Grace. Over the decades he has assisted with youth ministry, participated in music programs, and served on numerous committees and Church Council. In 1981, John married the love of his life, Diane, and together they raised Eric and Andrea, who they helped to grow in their Christian faith and life at Grace.

John has been thankful for the many experiences throughout his life, at Grace and other places, that have helped him grow in faith. A week of Leadership School at Capital University during high school drew him closer to God. He admits to some times of doubt, especially during college years far from home. He is a firm believer in the power of prayer, which got him through some tough times in his life, and he believes in answered prayer, acknowledging that sometimes it takes longer than expected. He learned from and was inspired by his father's faith, who, though he lived most of his life in a wheelchair, always took time for Bible reading and prayer, a practice which John has carried through his life, as well.

John, together with Diane, stays connected to Christ through their regular and faithful participation in worship and giving to Grace. "It's what I do. It's a part of my life," John says. Since his retirement from Rexam, John has been giving to Grace through his Required Minimum Distributions, a tax saving strategy. Would you like to know more about how you can give to Grace and reduce your taxes? John would be happy to tell you how to do it, so that, together, we can help Grace continue to change lives.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

On August 14, former president Donald Trump, along with 18 others, were indicted in Georgia for election interference. This indictment followed federal indictments for his efforts to overturn the 2020 election before and on January 6, and for mishandling classified documents, and another state charge for illegal campaign contributions.

The response to these indictments has been mixed, including "witch hunt" and "weaponization of government" and "outrageous" from one side, to "No one is above the law" from the other. Regardless of what the politicians and pundits say, Donald Trump remains the clear choice of Republican voters for the presidential nomination, and recent polls have Trump and Biden mostly even in a 2024 rematch.

These polls are a reminder that our country continues to be significantly politically divided, and there's no reason to believe that these differences don't carry over to our faith communities.

So, what is the best way forward? First of all, I'd suggest that we continuously remind ourselves of our sinfulness and need for forgiveness. We do this in our corporate worship. Some forms of the Confession and Forgiveness part of our worship use these words: "We confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves." Yes, even our political choices are tainted by sin.

Secondly, we can look to the Lutheran understanding of our faith for guidance. Martin Luther taught that the Christian lives in two kingdoms: The kingdom on the right, and the kingdom on the left. In the kingdom on the right, God freely justifies us by grace through faith in Christ's atoning work on the cross. This comes to us as a free gift, totally unrelated to anything we have or haven't done to deserve it.

That, in turn, frees me to fully serve my neighbor in the Kingdom on the left. For Luther, the kingdom on the left includes all manner of secular authority, or the powers of the state and of government, including the power to coerce and punish through a system of law and enforcement, all of which serves to restrain evildoers and protect citizens. Luther would say that the Christian is subject to both kingdoms.

One of my former seminary professors, Paul Sonnack, puts it this way:

"The crucial thing is that we understand that the Christian is subject to secular authority for the sake of the neighbor, not for his or her own sake. The fundamental presupposition for all ethical decisions lies in a proper distinction between what I need and what my neighbor needs. Luther insisted that in what concerns one's self, one is governed by the gospel and suffers injustice for one's self as a Christian; but in what concerns the neighbor and belongs to him or her, the Christian will be governed according to love and allow no injustice to the neighbor. Insofar as government and the structures of society are a blessing and a necessity for others, the Christian must do whatever he or she can to make its authority effective."

Another writer I have found helpful in my understanding of this has been Karl Hertz. He has written a book entitled "Politics is a Way of Helping People." With these words from the back of the book, an editor describes what to learn from the author: "In our time of crisis and disillusionment, he urges church members to join, get involved, and work in the political structure where the power is and where decisions are made. Politics can serve as an arena for improving the quality of life, for making collective and individual witness for helping people."

This book was published in 1974, when the primary political issues that were divisive were Civil Rights Movement and the Vietnam War. These were certainly times of crisis and disillusionment. That could easily describe our current political climate, in which we are divided about which political party has the policies and leaders to lead us forward as a nation.

Finally, we can continue to live in the covenant of our Baptism through keeping the promises that we make in the Affirmation of Baptism service:

- to live among God's faithful people
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- to serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth




Blessing of the Animals
