If you would like to be a **sponsor** (**reserved seating**), please call the church office, 419-332-1558. There are various price categories to choose from, beginning at \$50.





A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

In last month's pastor message, I reported to you that the Stewardship Team at Grace has been working hard to prepare for our fall appeal, which launched on Sunday, October 15. Our theme this year is "Blessed to be a Blessing," which recalls the promise God made to Abram in Genesis 12:1-3; "I will bless you so that you will be a blessing... In you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

The purpose behind Abram's call and blessing is to bless the world. And that charge to bless all people was taken up by Jesus, and passed on to us, his church. As members of Grace, the Northwestern Ohio Synod, and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, we respond by proclaiming the good news of God in Christ in word and in deed.

By now, most of you have received a letter from Grace, mailed the week of October 16, which outlined our fall Appeal and informed you of what to expect and dates for the most important elements of our program.

Our appeal this year is different in some important ways. The Stewardship Team has set a goal of \$40,000 in increased offerings for 2024. This is a little more than 10% of the \$391,000 that Grace members have given in the 12 months between August 1, 2022, and July 31, 2023, to support ministry at Grace. This level of generosity from Grace members is amazing!!

Another way that our appeal is different this year is that we have identified three "ministry initiatives" based on three identified "ministry needs" that form the basis for an "ask" for increased giving in 2024 to meet our goal. Allow me to summarize:

- **Ministry need:** Families in Fremont with preschool-age children are in need of faith-based early childhood education programs. Some families have expressed the need for childcare for the entire day.
 - ♦ **Ministry Initiative:** Grow and develop our Noah's Ark Preschool program.
- **Ministry need:** Many children in Northwest Ohio live in households at or below the poverty level, and do not have their own bed to sleep in.
 - Ministry Initiative: Build and deliver 50 single beds to local children and families in need.
- **Ministry need:** Find and call our next pastor and continue to support and fairly compensate our staff.
 - Ministry Initiative: Position Grace financially to call the pastor that we need, and to sustain ministry excellence.

Our Stewardship Appeal, Blessed to be a Blessing, is providing more information about these needs and initiatives. Our appeal is also seeking to inspire us to greater generosity through temple talks, mission moments, and will provide an opportunity to indicate our plan for giving in 2024. I hope you plan to join us as together we seek new ways to bless others!

God Does Not Let Me Quit

Just like most of us, at one time or another we just want to give up and quit. We are busy all week, so we quit coming to worship, we quit serving on the committees we have been a part of, we quit believing we have the capability to go where we feel God is callings us. Ed heard a sermon on discovering his gifts and talents when Maureen preached one Sunday. In the message he heard it said that a follower of Jesus was more than enough just as they are and if God called a follower to serve in an area, he would have already equipped them with what they needed to serve. God used these words to touch Ed's heart. He knew then and there God was not going to let him quit serving and that he was more than qualified to be on Church Council, eventually serving as president.

Over the years Ed has found his involvement at Grace meaningful and a blessing. Serving on several boards and participating in small groups has brought Ed peace. Ed says that as a young adult he was all about himself. But God was not going to give up on him and leave him there. As Ed has responded to each opportunity to serve and learn he has been blessed to be a blessing.

This is the message Ed would leave with the members of Grace. God won't give up on you. He will continue to bring opportunities to you to get involved through service and fellowship. When we realize God has equipped each of his followers with abilities and in Him all are more than qualified, we will go where God is calling us. When we do, we will find that we are truly blessed to be a blessing. The good news is, God won't give up on Ed and He won't give up on us!




Backpack Program Resumes




Breakfast in Bethlehem






CHURCH COUNCIL - Minutes October 9, 2023

Collections will go to Backpack Buddies program; Fall Fest Oct. 15; Grace Gathers will meet at Chateau Oct. 19; "Make your Wishes Known" funeral planning with Maureen planned for Nov. 18 at 10 a.m.; 3 boxes of food were taken to Food Pantry in September
- Worship: reviewed planners for Oct. & Nov. making adjustments to allow for Stewardship appeal & Temple talks; two weddings will be held at Grace in October; there will be special services for Reformation Sunday and All Saint's Day
- Property: Bathroom renovation continues, electrical inspection completed; Council approved \$11,600 for parking lot sealing & striping with job being done as weather permits; working on kitchen lighting; looking into motion lights for Courtyard
