Lent Begins

The season of Lent is a 40-day period of preparation for Easter. It began as a period of baptismal instruction for new Christians. It was their time of praying, fasting, and studying Scripture to be intentional about getting ready for the sacraments. Other Christians would join them in these spiritual practices as a sign of solidarity and discipleship. Some people use these 40 days as a time of intentional spiritual discipline, perhaps giving up something important to them as a reminder of Christ's sacrifice for us. Others use the Lenten journey as a time to take something on, like more intentional prayerful reflection, Bible reading, or service on behalf of justice. Our LIFT Congregations have many ways to grow during Lent. We will be offering a midweek worship opportunity with the theme of *Making Change* (See below for the full schedule). LIFT will also offer drive-thru ashes on February 14 from 8-10 AM and 3-5 PM in front of St. John's as an alternative for those not able to attend an Ash Wednesday service. I pray that Lent is a time for all of us to learn more about Jesus and refocus on who we are as people of faith. — Pastor Paul Bailie

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

In early February I will be going on a journey. On February 4, I will fly to Denver, Colorado, and from there will travel to Winter Park, where I will attend a continuing education event called Recreation and Revelation, and is held at Winter Park Mountain Lodge, across the road from Winter Park Ski Area.

The event features early morning worship and lectures from Monday through Thursday, with the rest of the mornings and afternoons free to explore the many ski slopes at Winter Park. Each day concludes with dinner and another learning session with this year's presenters, Dr.'s Kimberly Wagner and Mary Hinkle Shore. Wagner is a former preaching professor at Lutheran School of Theology Chicago, and Shore has been a New Testament professor and Dean at two of our ELCA seminaries.

Any long-distance trip requires a significant amount of preparation. My airline tickets have been purchased, and travel from the airport to Winter Park has been arranged. I have reserved equipment for four days of skiing -- skis, boots, poles, and a helmet.

On the church calendar, February is the month that we conclude our observance of the Epiphany season with the Transfiguration. This year that Sunday will fall on February 11 (very early this year!). One could say that the Transfiguration was a major part of Jesus' preparation for the journey that he would take to Jerusalem and to the cross, to suffer and die there as Messiah.

I remember when I was a kid, my brother, Phil, who was two years older than I, would go off with his friends to play. And I remember wanting so much to go along with him, to be a part of whatever fun that he and his friends had planned. I used to say, "Phil, take me with you!" In the same way, as we begin the season of Lent, as Jesus begins his journey to Jerusalem, I hope that we can have that same desire to go along, and for us to say, "Jesus, take me with you."

But if we want Jesus to take us with him, we need to be ready for a personal "transfiguration." Some of you may remember Dag Hammarskjöld, a Swede who was Secretary General of the UN from 1953 until his tragic death in a plane crash in 1961. A book Hammarskjöld wrote during his time in office has the title "Markings," and is regarded as a spiritual diary. He was a strong believer in the mystery of life and the mysteriousness of God. Early in the book he writes this reflection:

"Summoned to carry it; alone to assay it; chosen to suffer it; free to deny it. I saw for one moment the sail in the sun storm, far off on a wave crest alone, bearing from land. For one moment, I saw...."

And then he continues:

"From that moment, when I said Yes to Someone, I knew for sure that my life, in self-surrender, had meaning and had a goal."

Hammarskjöld could not necessarily name that moment, but for him it was transformational. We could also use the word "transfigurative." That may be true for us as well, where we had a visionary moment in our life, and we cannot pinpoint the exactness of the time of that moment, but we knew that our life had a meaning and a goal. We knew that God had called us for a purpose, for a destiny in this world, and that we surrendered ourselves to a purpose larger than ourselves.

So, I wonder: in the story of the Transfiguration, was it Jesus who changed or was it John, James, and Peter who were changed, and could now see the face of God shining in the man they knew? When they came down from the mountaintop, did they surrender themselves to a purpose larger than themselves?


That becomes a crucial question for us, too, as we come down from the Mount of Transfiguration, and begin our Lenten journey, as we travel with Jesus to Jerusalem and the cross. That journey will begin on February 14, Ash Wednesday, as we humble ourselves a bit, and allow ourselves to be marked with an ashen cross. In so doing, we are reminded not only of our mortality, but from whence the hope of eternal life comes. I hope that it can be for us a time when we travel with Jesus, and experience "transfiguration."




