I WANT TO BE A MISSIONARY!

"I want to be a missionary!" These were the words spoken by 12-year-old Becky Seibert after hearing a missionary speak at her church, Church of the Brethren. Becky is the sixth of eight children. Even as a child Becky has had an appreciation for family and the blessing of being close to family as Becky's family all lived on the same road. That made it easy for Becky to attend church every Sunday with her grandparents. She participated in VBS, helped in the kitchen and helped the Ladies Aid group make quilts. But the day Becky heard the missionary speak, a fire was ignited in her to be a missionary.

As we all know, life often gets in the way of our callings and at the same time brings blessings. When Becky married Pastor Henry in 2000, they blended her 2 sons and Henry's 2 daughters into one family. Becky became a pastor's wife, but the desire to be a missionary was still there.

At the time Becky and Pastor Henry married he was serving as the Associate Pastor at St. John's Lutheran church in Bellevue. Becky had found a family there. So, when Pastor Henry went into intentional interim ministry, Becky said to him, we need a congregation. That brought them to Grace.

At first Grace seemed too big to Becky and she didn't like it here. But she knew how important it is to get involved and begin to know people and begin to develop that feeling of family. She joined the bell choir, attended Bible study, and helped with Altar guild. But even though she was serving in several areas here at Grace and beginning to feel like a member of this family, there was always that desire to be a missionary.

Becky has made 12 missionary trips to Africa and has received the support of this church family in numerous ways. Whether Becky is promoting a trip by dressing up as a chicken or being pushed down the aisle in a bed surrounded with mosquito netting to promote the need for helping the African people with farm animals or mosquito netting, this congregation has helped. Becky has received donations of sewing supplies, school supplies, gift bag supplies, and private monetary donations from her church family. This congregation has helped to supply the Africans with everything from water wells to children's hand bells. All of this was made possible due to Becky letting us know what is needed.

When asked why she has gone to Africa 12 times Becky replies, "Because God told me to go." "When God keeps presenting it, you go."

This is the gift Becky has brought to this church family. The opportunity to not only learn about Africa, but the opportunity to help provide for our African brothers and sisters.

When you ask Becky what she gets out of being a member of Grace and being a missionary to Africa, she will tell you she gets more than she gives. Whether it is serving on the hand bell choir, altar guild, or traveling to Africa, she receives the joy of seeing the hearts and minds of people who love to serve. The joy of creating a family of church members, brothers and sisters in Africa, as well as traveling companions.

We can all agree, the little 12-year-old girl who wanted to be a missionary has grown up to be a missionary who has made a big difference in the lives of all who know her.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

The penitential season of Lent began early this year on Ash Wednesday, February 14. For many, giving up something is a common way of observing this season. It can be a strong reminder that our Lord gave up everything for us, his very life.

The ashes of Ash Wednesday are a reminder of our mortality ("to dust you shall return") and, along with sackcloth (no plans to use that anytime soon at Grace!), an ancient biblical symbol of remorse and repentance. The somber tone of Lent is appropriate for a season that asks us to take stock of ourselves and recommit to being the kind of disciples God wants us to be.

But Lent (which means "the lengthening of days" or simply "Spring") is a time of joy and hope, too. With repentance comes renewal -- a "spiritual Spring" if you will. During Lent, we prepare to walk alongside our Lord as He makes His journey to the Cross. This requires turning 180 degrees from our sinfulness and following in the footsteps of the Servant-King.

The biblical term for this action is repentance and is one of the practices that the Ash Wednesday liturgy invites us to. The invitation to Lent, spoken by the pastor, identifies several practices; "self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love -- strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament."

None of these practices necessarily comes easily. The more difficult ones for me are self-examination and repentance, with the latter even more difficult than the former. It is difficult enough for me to take an honest look at myself and my behavior, what Twelve-Step recovery programs call "a fearless moral inventory," and how that behavior affects other people. It is even more difficult for me to make changes in my life and behavior that will reduce the negative impact that such behavior unleashes upon others.

In spite of whatever difficulty, we experience in our Lenten journey, if we go the distance in our spiritual walk with Jesus, we will be there to see the glory of the open tomb! The promise of resurrection on Easter Sunday! God's eternal Kingdom fully realized!

Those Ash Wednesday words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," are a strong reminder of the fragility of life, and that our days on earth are indeed finite. But God's plan for us, God's loving embrace of us, is everlasting. All thanks be to God who makes it so!

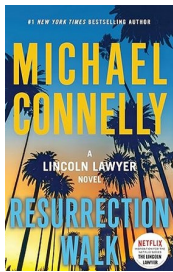

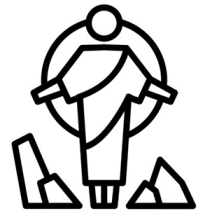

LIFT to Celebrate Easter Vigil on March 30

LIFT will celebrate the Easter Vigil on March 30 at 7 PM at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Fremont. In the early centuries of Christianity, baptisms were only performed at one time a year—Easter Vigil. Persons new to Christianity—catechumens—were baptized at the Easter Vigil and welcomed into the faith. In preparation, the catechumens would have a period of preparation, usually involving prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. This time became Lent. For our LIFT vigil, we'll start outside around the fire, then process inside with candles to hear creative retellings of salvation Bible stories. We'll remember our Baptism and celebrate Holy Communion.

- Christian Worship: the Hymn Selection Committee will meet and select hymns for March and April
- Christian Property: the Grace Lutheran Church signs that are located around Fremont were taken down by Pr. Henry Seibert & Greg Jess; they will be re-done with updated worship times, etc. Looking into building security options; obtaining quotes to convert sanctuary entrance doors with new hardware; drinking fountain in Sunday School hallway has been repaired; CPR training class was well attended and went well.
