#### **Connie Amor is Addicted to Volunteering!**

People get addicted to negative things because it makes them feel good. Connie Amor is addicted to volunteering for the same reason. Giving my time to serve in my church makes me feel good and it just gets in your blood. You want to do more and more!

This addiction all started for Connie when her daughters, Liza and Kelly, were just little girls. Connie was raised at St. John's but was not active there. Her father-in-law at the time, Wayne Graham, told her to be ready on Sunday morning because he was picking Connie and the girls up and they were going to Sunday School. Connie was ready that Sunday and it began a journey into volunteering that Connie still thrives on today.

It was not long before Connie joined Grace and was helping in the Sunday School office and volunteering with the snacks for Vacation Bible School.

From there Connie taught Sunday School for 10 years and volunteered in the nursery. By this time the volunteering bug was in her blood.

The next opportunity brought to Connie was to run for Church Council. She was elected and has served every time she was eligible since the late 1990s filling positions such as vice-president, treasurer, and secretary. Why does Connie find serving on the Church Council so fulfilling? "I love it because you represent your fellow members, know what is going on behind the scenes, and are part of a close-knit group of people who care about the future of Grace Lutheran Church." Connie has also served on the Missions/Outreach committee since becoming a member of Church Council.

When Connie is out and about in the community and has the opportunity to tell others about her church, she tells them what a welcoming congregation we are. It is like a family. We have traditions we love, but we are also open to change. Being a member of Grace Lutheran and serving wherever and whenever I can has helped me grow spiritually. I am more aware of the power of God at work in me and working through me. Connie looks forward to worship and says she finds great peace and a feeling of family in our sanctuary.

There is no question many people find addictions to negative things that make them feel good. But Connie has found an addiction to volunteering that makes her feel good and hopes more people find the same thing she has as they give their time to serving here at Grace and in the community.

# A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

In 1874, a Lutheran congregation was established by Norwegian immigrants on the west side of interstate Lake Hendricks, which was then Dakota Territory. The new congregation was named Singsaas, as most of the charter members had immigrated from the small Norwegian village of Singsås, located about 50 miles south of the larger city of Trondheim.

Among those immigrants who joined that congregation were both sets of my paternal great-grandparents, who are buried in the cemetery which surrounds the church on three sides. By 1900, a village on the east (and Minnesota) side of Lake Hendricks was incorporated and assumed the same name as the lake.

The Singsaas congregation was instrumental in creating a second congregation in the village of Hendricks, which was named First. This is the congregation in which I was baptized, confirmed, and ordained as a pastor. From its beginning in 1900, First and Singsaas shared a pastor, until 2010 when Singsaas voted to leave the ELCA.

Since departing the ELCA, Singsaas found it difficult to find a pastor. Eventually, a charismatic nondenominational pastor was called, who dramatically changed everything at Singsaas, including its constitution and statement of faith. This has meant a total repudiation of its Lutheran identity. The pastor, whose name is Jason, has ruled with a dictatorial style, freely expelling from church membership life-long members who disagree with him or challenge his leadership.

A major controversy erupted several years ago when the congregation, under Jason's leadership, attempted to gain control of the Singsaas Cemetery Association's (SCA) significant financial assets. SCA is an independent corporation, separate from the congregation. Gun toting guards were posted at the door of the church where an SCA annual meeting was being held. Former members of this congregation, some of whom have been expelled, others who have left, many of whom I grew up with and some are cousins, grieve the loss of their congregation. For them it all began to unravel when the congregation voted to leave the ELCA. The ELCA Model Constitution for Congregations guarantees that those who want to remain Lutheran, even if that group is in the minority, retain title to the property.

Remaining in the ELCA also ensures that only candidates who undergo rigorous screening as candidates for rostered ministry, and thorough biblical, theological, and pastoral training, are certified for call to an ELCA congregation or ministry.

The Grace Call Committee recently experienced a big disappointment. A candidate who they had interviewed several times including in person, was deemed a good fit for Grace, and was informed that he would be recommended to the congregation for call. The candidate discerned that the Holy Spirit was not calling him to Grace. His gifts for ministry will be used in another congregation.

But Grace can be assured that eventually the Holy Spirit will bring a pastoral candidate and Grace congregation together. A call will be issued, and the call will be accepted. And all will know that the right fit has been found.

Thank you! Right before Christmas Duane suddenly had symptoms that something was wrong. After a couple of doctor's appointments, an MRI, and an endoscopy it was determined that Duane had a tumor in the pancreatic duct. The pathology report came back that Duane has pancreatic cancer. On February 7 Duane had what is thought to be one of the most drastic surgeries you can have, the Whipple Surgery to remove the tumor and 15 lymph nodes. It was a 9-hour surgery. He has amazed the doctors with how well he has recovered from the surgery. The good news is there was no cancer in the lymph nodes. The bad news is there are still some positive cells on the back

wall that the surgeon could not get. So, in about 5 weeks Duane will begin six months of chemo treatments. The doctor is optimistic that Duane will handle it well, as he is otherwise very fit and healthy. She is optimistic that this will give Duane a healthy life to look forward to.

Duane and I want to thank all of you for your support, love and prayers. Thank you for all the cards, food, gift cards, visits and kind words. You have truly shared the love of Christ with us as you allowed Jesus to work through you. This is a very scary time for our family but with our church family supporting us we are confident we will make it and are looking forward to celebrating Thanksgiving this year knowing Duane is cancer free.

# LIFT to Celebrate Easter Vigil on March 30

LIFT will celebrate the Easter Vigil on March 30 at 7 PM at St. Mark Lutheran

Church in Fremont. In the early centuries of Christianity, baptisms were only performed at one time a year—Easter Vigil. Persons new to Christianity—catechumens—were baptized at the Easter Vigil and welcomed into the faith. In preparation, the catechumens would have a period of preparation, usually involving prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. This time became Lent. For our LIFT vigil, we'll start outside around the fire, then process inside with candles to hear creative retellings of salvation Bible stories. We'll remember our Baptism and celebrate Holy Communion.





### WHY WE SING HYMNS

I was born and raised a Presbyterian and spent almost fifty years in a church music career as a Presbyterian, but Christians everywhere sing hymns in worship for the same reasons, as Luther said, to express our praise to God, to

teach us theological doctrine, and help us grow in a relationship with God. Luther went so far as to say, "Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." That's pretty strong stuff and warrants our attention!

Not only are we giving our praise to God, but the words of the hymns we are singing shape our beliefs, inform our beliefs and how we live. In addition to the Scriptures and the sermon we listen to, we then sing, embody, breathe the words of the hymns and liturgical music as we move through the service. The first hymn is a hymn of praise; the second hymn is a hymn that comments on the Gospel reading; the Communion hymns, of course, talk about the Table, bread and wine; and finally the Sending hymn takes us out into the world with the message of the day in our hearts, fortified by the hymns we have just sung.

Our hymns are chosen each month by a hymn-loving group who consider many different factors as we sit around a table and prayerfully look at Bible and Hymnal. It is a wonderful experience to hear different ideas expressed. One idea that I would like to try in the coming months is a once-a-month pre-worship hymn-sing. On the second Sunday of each month you the congregation could bring your favorite hymn to sing a couple of verses before church. We could practice singing with great gusto and joy!
