As we walk this Lenten Road and as we turn the pages in our calendar from March into April, we come to realize that Holy Week is fast approaching! Together, we will shout our hosannas and praise as

we gather for worship on Palm Sunday (April 12 & 13). Then we will journey ever closer to the cross as gather in the Upper Room with Jesus and his disciples on Maundy Thursday (April 17). The cross stands in a central place for our evening worship on Good Friday (April 18). During our afternoon worship on Saturday (April 19), we will join in an ancient tradition of celebrating the Easter Vigil as we keep watch for the good news of Jesus' resurrection. Then, finally on Sunday, April 20, the trumpets sound the good news that the stone has been rolled away, and we proclaim the message of hope, joy, and love that only the Risen Christ can bring.

I could easily write an entire newsletter article on each one of these festive worship occasions. However, this month I'd like to go deeper and invite you to what I hope will be a wonderful evening of worship as we gather on April 17. Maundy Thursday has always been one of my favorite moments of worship. It's rich in meaning and tradition as we walk with Jesus on the night he was betrayed. As I have shared conversation with our Worship Planning Team, we would like to try something new, well outside the scope of what a "normal" worship service might look like.

Imagine with me . . . Maundy Thursday begins with Jesus and the disciples gathering in the Upper Room for dinner. Before the meal begins, Jesus takes on the role of a servant as he bathes the feet of the disciples. As we gather, you are invited to do the same. We will gather in our "Upper Room" as we share a simple meal in the auditorium. We will take time to enjoy fellowship with one another, and model Jesus' example of servanthood through the washing of feet (or hands for those who have the heebie-jeebies).

Following the meal with his disciples, Jesus begins a new tradition. He breaks bread. He lifts a cup. He shares familiar words, "This is my body. This is my blood. Given and shed for you." For this portion of our evening together, we will move to the Nave as we gather around Table of our Lord. Just as Jesus once broke bread, we will do the same as we also welcome our First Communion youth to the table.

Jesus' night then moved to prayer and reflection as he and the disciples journeyed to the Garden of Gethsemane. Prayers were offered. A betrayer was at hand. An arrest was made. The disciples scattered. Our night will include much the same. From the Communion Table we will journey to our courtyard where we will gather around the fire, pray, and keep watch as the story unfolds, and we walk ever closer to the pains of Good Friday.

I believe it will be a rich evening for us together! Each of the three stops for the night will include retelling Jesus' story, prayer, hymn singing, and living the experience of that particular part of the story. Imaging, faithfully walking through the evening as we are invited to experience Maundy Thursday as it once may have been.

Because the evening includes a meal, we will be encouraging reservations, so that we can plan accordingly. Please stay tuned for more information in the near future.


- Individuals must be 18 years or older.


