Christ is risen!

Good news has come as Mary Magalene is greeted by the angels at the now open tomb! Christ is alive! Alleluia!

If someone ever asked me what does Easter mean to me, a quick answer might be “it’s the icing on the cake!” It seems like an odd expression, but as much as I enjoy my sweets, it is a fitting image for us to reflect on. Ponder with me for just a few moments.

Christmas, yes, we’ll start there, is like the plate or platter. As Christ is born and welcomed into the world, God is presenting us this wonderful gift as he takes on our human nature and lies humbly in the manger. So, Christ is the plate or platter, on which good things are soon to be presented.

Good Friday is the cake! Here, we get the heart of this God given gift. Good Friday is the treat we get to enjoy as Jesus gives his very life out of sheer devotion for us, God’s chosen people. 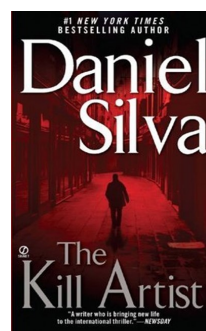

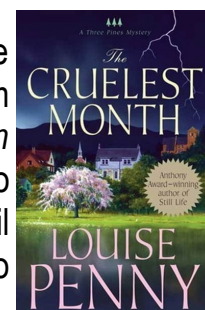


BOOKWORMS

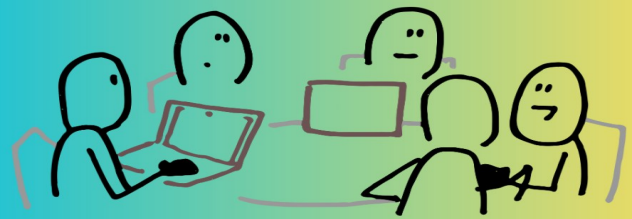

Elections will take place prior to worship on Saturday, May 3 and Sunday, May 4. Absentee voting is available in the church office during business hours.
- **MISSIONS/OUTREACH:** Noisy Offering collected for first quarter totaled \$648.16 and will be given to Let's Build Beds project; 2nd quarter Noisy Offering will go to Bridge of Hope Food Pantry.
- **WORSHIP:** finalized worship plans for Holy Week
- **PROPERTY:** Dining Room lighting will be replaced on an as needed basis; Service Elevator Ceiling (\$10,495) on hold; Main Office door lever lock with wrap around (\$1035); Security System 95% complete, will schedule joint meeting for training; Midwest Maintenance completed exterior building repairs
- **STEWARDSHIP:** re-evaluating approach for Stewardship campaign
- **YOUTH:** First Communion Mini Retreat held on April 12, two students will receive their First Communion on Maundy Thursday; Craft & Crop fundraising events have raised \$665 for the Soup Kitchen; the youth will host the annual Easter Breakfast on Easter Sunday to include breakfast casseroles & Prairie Mkt. sausage, a photo backdrop will be available for family photos, and activities for the kids; Summer Camp will take place June 29 through July 2; we have received one request for Spring yard work. Heather is looking into a \$4,000 grant for Park Night this summer. More info to come.
- **Soup Kitchen update** - Pr. Bailey thanked Tracy Michles for the great job she is doing overseeing the meal planning; Pontifex has visited and is impressed; they will share their excess food items with us. The Soup Kitchen is feeding 35-50 people. St. Mark Lutheran has 2 groups who will now volunteer at the Soup Kitchen.
- **Maureen invited** women of Grace to attend the Eastern Conference Women's Spring Gathering that will take place Saturday, April 26 at St. Mark Lutheran, Fremont
