By the time you read this it will be old news, but Wendy and I found a house just outside Fremont! We recently closed on the purchase, inherited keys, and have been busy making the house more of our home before we begin moving. If all goes as planned, we anticipate an official move on July 14th. As we are soon to be packing boxes, painting walls, and establishing home, I can't help but ponder how many times have God's faithful people been relocated.

With a quick Google search, AI quickly chimed in with: "the Bible tells of numerous instances of people relocating." No exact number could be given because there is story after story of God's faithful people being relocated. Take for example:

CHURCH COUNCIL - Minutes June 9, 2025

- Installation of Church Council members will take place during worship on June 21 and 22.
- NO COUNCIL MEETING IN JULY regular meeting schedule will reconvene in August.
- **INNOVATE GRANT** (a microgrant from the Synod) was awarded to Grace Lutheran, to be used in Fremont to nurture our neighbors and listen to our community. Programs for youth are planned for Mondays & Tuesdays, and a community BBQ is scheduled for each Tuesday evening June through August.
- MISSIONS/OUTREACH: Noisy Offering collected in June totaled \$192.61 and will go to the Bridge of Hope Food Pantry; 3rd quarter Noisy Offering will go to Liberty Center; planning continues for Let's Build Beds, the Food Committee met and decisions have been made. There will be an organizational meeting on July 16 at 6PM. We have collected enough bedding and pillows; the Bookworms group has chosen the book for their next read - *The Covenant of Water* by Abraham Verghese
- WORSHIP: did not meet; they will meet again in July.
- PROPERTY: Midwest Maintenance is securing quotes to repair sidewalk damage caused by the manlift; Church Mutual
 facility survey is in progress; "thank you" to Bill Schling for assisting Jim Post in the removal of scrap steel; boxwoods
 have been trimmed; service elevator painted; toilet replaced in office area; repositioned parking lot stops, working to
 de-clutter several areas
- STEWARDSHIP: Did not meet.
- YOUTH: VBS is June 23-26 in the evening at Hayes UMC; Summer Park activities have begun Games & Gatorade (middle & high school), Paint Me a Story (pre K-2nd grade), Faithful Expressions (3rd-6th grade); 7 kids will attend summer camp June 29-July 2
- NOAH'S ARK PRESCHOOL Exciting news! The preschool was selected as a grant recipient to receive funding through the Lee N. Koenig Legacy Fund. The amount of \$100,000 will be spendable over the next 5 years to support preschool expansion. The preschool is currently looking into extended care and re-envisioning the preschool program.
