As I sit down to write this article the news is a buzz with reports as President Trump has declared federal control over Washington D.C.. In the midst of the many words shared, reports made, and questions asked, one of the most

overlooked items within this declaration is the removal of all the homeless from D.C.. I will have to admit I'm struggling with this particular declaration. As a nation, I think we can do better than sheer military force. As Christians, I know we are called love and serve our neighbor regardless of status in life.

My ministry journey with homelessness stems back to my first Call in Norfolk, Virginia. Every day my route from home to church took me under I-64 where a small encampment was tucked up in the beams of the underpass. I saw it nearly every day. As I would drive by it would sadden me. I would pray for them as I passed by. However, not once in my three years of serving at St. John's did I ever stop. Not once did I ever think of suggesting this as an outreach ministry. I can make excuses: I was young. I was inexperienced. Yet, as a person of faith I should have and could have done something.

It wasn't until I moved to Florida, two congregations later, that I was able to begin putting my desire to serve the homeless to work. Where we lived, it didn't take long to transition from driving past the rich and famous into the cardboard encampments of the homeless. At Nativity, where I served as pastor, we had a partnership with two congregations that were mission centered. Together we were able to feed, cloth, spend time with, and pour out love upon those who were calling the streets home. I even spent one weekend trimming toenails and giving foot baths just outside the doors of one of our partner congregations. Talk about humbling!

As I moved from Florida back to Ohio, I came to realize that homelessness is still a concern but it's not as visual because in our area they are the "hidden homeless" meaning they sleep in cars, couch surf, are loft above someone's garage. Several years ago, I got involved with the Homeless Coalition in Tiffin. Here we fed, provided mattress, and eventually worked toward opening Seneca County's first homeless shelter. I say all of this not to gloat, but as a kind reminder that homelessness is an issue everywhere. Yes, even here in Fremont there are homeless individuals. From time to time, they'll find their way into our courtyard sleeping on the cool steps or sitting in the shade. It warms my heart knowing that we can provide a simple safe space for them to find some rest. Still, I am reminded that there is much work to be done.

I say all of this as I recently read an article by Diana Butler Bass, a well-respected Christian author, preacher, and historical theologian. Diana writes:

Jesus was homeless for most of his life.

We don't think about it very often, but it is true. He was born in a stable far from home. His family fled to escape the murderous King Herod. They returned for a time and lived in Nazareth. But, as soon as Jesus began his public ministry, he was run out of his own hometown. He became an itinerant preacher living off of charity, staying with friends and followers, or sleeping outdoors in the rough or on roads. Of himself, he remarked, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head."

He told stories, like the one we call "The Good Samaritan," about people without homes. Jesus always sided with the homeless. He embraced and healed them. And he died with no grave of his own — his final resting place was a gift from a wealthy disciple.

Jesus was born, lived, and died as an unhoused person.

We don't often think of Jesus as "homeless," yet her words speak truth. Jesus, Son of God, King of kings, lived on the streets and was dependent upon the hospitality and grace of others! Now I can't tell you how to think politically, but as a pastor I can remind you that we are called to share the love of God with all people regardless of income status, gender, sexuality, race, creed, or color. We can't do that with a bulldozer, as some are proposing might be done in D.C.. We can't do that with a garbage truck, as others are proposing

could be done in D.C.. We can't do that if we are building walls and barricades. We can only do that if we are building relationships, listening to stories, and walking side by side with everyone we encounter. That's the ministry of Jesus. This is the ministry we are called to be a part of.



SLAM Bible study on Fear begins September 10 at 5 pm. Grace Gathers had 14 in attendance. The next gathering is August 21 at Chateau.
- WORSHIP: On August 31, Linda Baumer will be recognized for her years of service. September 13/14 is Let's Build Beds. On September 20/21 Holy Land visitors will be here for Temple Talk. A baptism is scheduled for the September 27 Worship Service. Hymns are planned for the month. The Toledo Symphony changed their date to December 18. We will be unable to have the large tree in front of the church. There can possibly be two pencil trees up by the altar. The Symphony committee will possibly be helping with the cost of the trees. The committee meets in October.
- **PROPERTY**: Sidewalk repairs are completed. Security System is complete with all sensors reporting. The Main Office door closure was completed on August 12. Ed Urban will begin landscaping the week of August 11. The snowplow asphalt damage was inspected, and the handicap arrows will be paid for and completed.
