A note from our pastor ...



If you have, and I'm assuming you have, you've likely seen it on a t-shirt, bumper sticker, or window cling. Like Martin Luther, I first asked, "What does this mean?" and I came to realize the translation has a lot of depth especially as we approach Holy Week and the great celebration of Easter!

- "G" - Is for God. Occasionally I've seen this image with a \oplus meaning the cross. Either way, God or the Cross guides us into appreciating the next few characters.
- ">" - Think back to your elementary math days, as far away as this may have been as a quick refresher this is the "Greater Than" symbol.
- "△" - Follow the way this symbol points and we are looking "up".
- "▽" - In the same manner, follow the way this symbol points and we are looking "down."

All told, $G > \triangle \nabla$ means, "God is greater than our ups and downs!" We could substitute "the Cross" for God. We could substitute "highs and lows" or "Mountains and Valleys" for ups and downs. Still the meaning is the same: "God is greater than our ups and downs!" As we venture into this Holy Week celebration, we realize that God is indeed greater than our highs and our lows. While our journey to the cross is nearly complete, we encounter the lowest point of our human story. Our sin, our shame, our foolishness, and selfish ambition places Christ on the cross. The pure, sinless, spotless, Lamb of God is crucified in our place. We may ask, "How low could we go?" In gazing upon the cross, this is our ∇ moment. Yet the story doesn't end there!

Thanks be to God there is a mountain top moment yet to come. Our \triangle moment is celebrating the greatest news ever proclaimed. The angel once said to Mary, "He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." (Matthew 28:6). Here, good news is poured for all generations. Through the glories of Easter, we realize the true power, awe, mystery and wonder of God as death is not and never will be the final answer. With God, new life always abounds.

As we venture into these holy and precious days, let us recall not only the good news of Christ's resurrection, but let us remember that in everything we do "God is greater than our ups and downs!" No matter what we have going on. No matter how good it may seem, or how bad things may feel, God is greater than all of it!

Celebrating God's Blessings in the highs and lows!

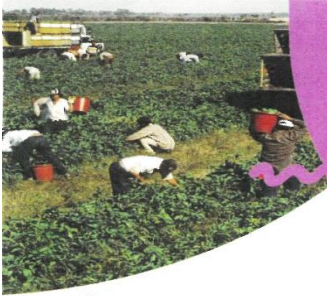

- **WORSHIP:** No Report – Did not meet
- **PROPERTY:** “*Thank You*” to Jim Post and all the volunteers who helped decorate the church for the Toledo Symphony and holiday season! Action Items: There is a need to have regular nightly service on the boilers. We are getting a quote from Gem Industries. Viewport software for RSS is complete. Office door latching issue was addressed. Greg will order Bird X. Jim and Tracy Michles will clean out window wells. Greg will take care of the Courtyard motion light and Sign lighting. A quote for the kitchen wall repair from Zimmerman was \$8,700. Backlog Items: Baker Street repairs; Service Elevator ceiling repair; Re-lamp dining room to LED; Kitchen ceiling tile replacement; Replace door hardware on remaining doors with ‘orange bar;’ Outlying signs.
- **STEWARDSHIP:** Did not meet. Next meeting will be in March 2026.
- **Youth:** No Council Action Items. Possible ‘Soup-er’ Bowl and Game night Saturday, February 7 at 4p.
