A NOTE FROM PASTOR BAILEY

One of my joys this past Summer was attending the Rostered Ministers Gathering in Indianapolis. Approximately 600 clergy from across the ELCA gathered for four days of worship, reflection, study, and renewal of our faith. The theme was

“Woven Together” and many of keynote speakers, Bible Studies, and small group activities reflected on the fabric of our lives in which we are ever woven. In the midst of it all, our “artist in residence”, Pastor Lori Kochanski of Upstate New York, was weaving. Yes, you read that correctly, Pastor Lori brought her loom and spent her week listening and weaving. In the end she made a beautiful processional banner that was a part of our closing worship together.



Now I don't know about you, but I've never given much thought to weaving before. Sure, I helped my sister weave a few potholders and coasters on our small plastic loom when we were children. I probably weaved a few of those myself, that of course was all the rage in the 1980's. I can also recall the large loom that is on display in Greenfield Village near Detroit. I even have a small loom made by a 10-year-old girl complete with an unfinished rug hanging between its treads that I brought home from my missionary trip to the Navajo Nation in Rock Point Arizona. It sits proudly in the corner of my office as a reminder of my faith formation and Call to ministry. But beyond that, how much do I know, or do you know about weaving? Very little!

There is a warp (the tread that runs up and down). There is the weft (the thread that runs from left to right). There is a shuttle that moves the threads back and forth. There are mechanics (sometimes) to move the warp in and out, and there are combs to help make everything nice and tight. Even as I learned all of that, my biggest take away is the tread that is used. It's not always the same. I never thought about that. Of course I knew that, but I never thought much about it. Some is stronger. Some is thinner. Some can bear a lot of weight and pressure, others cannot. Which is exactly where you and I come into this particular story.

We are all unique. (Thanks be to God for that!) From time to time, we may feel stressed, worn thin, or fraying and at our wits end. Like the many threads and fabrics woven together to make



a banner, rug, or blanket, so too are we! We are woven together into a community of faith. We are woven together in relationships with one another. We are woven together in the many and vast social networks of which we are a part. In each one of these tapestries that make up our lives, it is our collective whole that makes us strong. It is also our unique individual characteristics that make this tapestry of life so colorful.

In the moments when you feel frayed in life, know that you have been woven into the fabric of our faith and that others are here to carry the weight and burdens with you. In the moments when life seems alive, alert, and full of color,

know that you have been woven into the fabric of our faith so that our joys may brighten the grays and browns of other less brilliant threads. Let us remember that it is through Christ, and God's unending love that is unconditionally poured out upon us, that we are indeed woven together in mutual love and respect for one another! Then let us ponder how beautiful the tapestry of God's love may be!

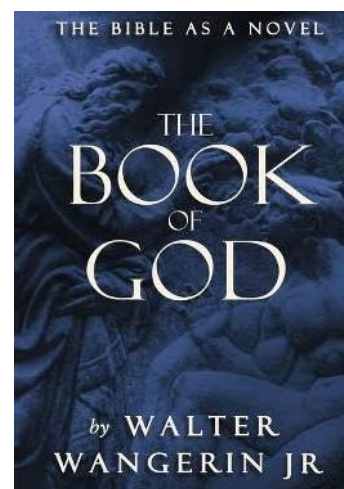

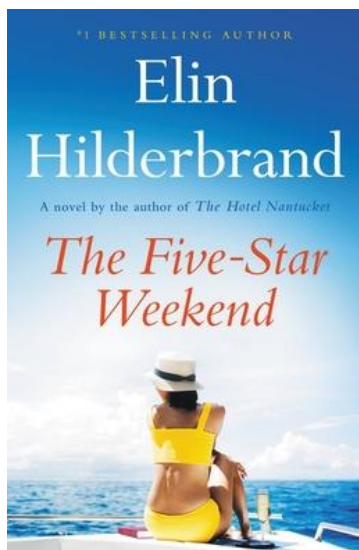

JUNE 2026

- **MISSIONS/OUTREACH:** Continued work on the Progressive Dinner that will be on June 12 at 5:00 pm.
- **WORSHIP:** Next meeting that was rescheduled from the May meeting will be June 10, 2026 at 3p. The Old Testament sermon series continues until November 2026. Hymns were selected to reflect Old Testament stories. For fun, some songs will be Sunday school favorites. Reminders: June 27 LIFT service in amphitheater – there will not be a Saturday Service. The July 5th Service will include a July 4th medley. There will not be a Service on July 4th.
- **PROPERTY:** Items to share with Council: Jim Post has added new shelving units in the Soup Kitchen storage room. He has also started trimming bushes and helped Noah's Ark prepare the areas of Noah's be painted in June. Sealant is needed for the foundation gap near the waste container. It was also noted that the Rt 6 sign is deteriorating.
- **Action Items:** Order Bird X; Replaced some light fixtures in the main office with LED. Clean out window wells; Courtyard motion light and sign lighting. Verify Soup Kitchen storage room sump size; Office overhead light fixture replacement. **Backlog Items:** Baker Street repairs; Kitchen wall repairs; Service Elevator ceiling repair; Re-lamp dining room to LED; Kitchen ceiling tile replacement; Replace door hardware on remaining doors with 'orange bar'; Outlying signs
- **STEWARDSHIP:** Meeting was held on June 4, 2026. Financial giving remains stable and people are being generous in spite of higher prices and inflation. Discussed the upcoming Fall Stewardship Campaign. We continue to lean towards the food and fellowship gatherings similar to last fall but hosting 4 instead of 8. - **Youth:** Vacation Bible School will be held June 22 – 25, 2026. The youth committee attended a fresh Expressions event.
